

4-H Static Exhibit Requirements 2011

Exhibit tags and Explanation cards are available from the Extension office. Explanation cards can also be found on the web at <http://oregon.4h.oregonstate.edu/fair-exhibit-and-contest-materials>.

All exhibits except Clothing & Textiles and Cut Flowers require the 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103). Check the fairbook for additional exhibit qualifications. All static entries except Food and Horticulture are due on Saturday, August 13. Food and Horticulture exhibits are due on Monday, August 15.

CLOVERBUD EXHIBITS (K-3rd grades)

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103) – one entry per category
- All static entries due Saturday, August 13 and Monday, August 15
- Small animals due Tuesday, August 16 10:00-11:00 am

EXHIBITS OPEN TO ALL MEMBERS - Recycle Waste Reduction, Recycle Reuse, Conservation, Educational Displays, Videography, and Computers

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Check fairbook for specific instructions or appropriate explanation card

COMMUNICATIONS

Educational Displays – open to all members/projects

- Maximum two exhibits per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Educational Display Exhibit Explanation Card (000-01) (revised 5-11)
- Each piece must have name, county and class number securely attached
- Display criteria
 - Poster or 3-D display – no notebooks or books
 - Individual size 30" wide, 24" deep, 36" high
 - Club size 60" wide, 24" deep, 36" high.

Videography – open to all members/projects

- May exhibit one exhibit per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Videography Exhibit Explanation Card (213-002)
- Must be 30 seconds to 10 minutes in length, not including entry info at beginning
- Any media clips not recorded by member must be public domain and not infringe on copyrights
- Must be in a format viewable from any computer or uploaded to website

NATURAL SCIENCES AND OUTDOOR PROJECTS

Conservation – open to all members/projects

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Educational Display Exhibit Explanation Card (000-01) must be attached
- Educational exhibit relating to conservation of soil, water, forests, marine life, range or wildlife
- Each exhibit piece must be labeled with name, county & class number
- Size may not exceed 30" wide, 24" deep, 36" high

Aquatic Ecology & Sports Fishing

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Aquatic Ecology and Sport Fishing Explanation Card (451-07)
- Each exhibit piece must be labeled with the member's name, county, and the class number

Aquatic Macro-Invertebrate (M-I) Specimens

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Aquatic Ecology and Sport Fishing Explanation Card (451-07)
- Aquatic Fauna Specimens: see fair book.
- Fish Prints: Juniors 1 print; Intermediates 2 prints; Seniors 3 prints. See fair book.

Entomology

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- See county fair book for specific class instructions. There is no explanation card for Entomology exhibits.
- Each piece must be labeled with member's name, county and class number.
- All insects must be collected in the current year for Junior's First Year. At least 50% of those displayed by Juniors, second and third year, Intermediates and Seniors must have been collected in the current year.
- Be sure to use the current order names for the identification of specimens, as found in "*Borror and DeLong's Introduction to the Study of Insects, 7th edition*" by Triplehorn and Johnson.

Forestry

- May have one or more exhibits
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Forestry Specimen Collection Site Analysis Sheet (441-05) for each specimen
- Forestry Mounting Page (441-07) for each specimen
- Each exhibit piece must be labeled with the member's name, county, and the class number
- Three dimensional display size maximum is 30" in length, 24" deep (front to back), and 36" high. The flat board maximum size is 22" by 28"
- Forestry specimen books do not need an explanation cards. Advanced Forestry exhibits need the Educational Display Explanation Card

Marine Science

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103) securely attached to exhibit
- 4-H Educational Display Exhibit Explanation Card (000-01)
- Each exhibit MUST be labeled on the back or bottom with the member's name, county, and class number
- Follow size specifications for Educational Displays

Other Natural Science – Beekeeping, Geology, and Outdoor Science

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Each exhibit piece must be labeled with the member's name, county, and the class number
- Check fairbook for specific class instructions

SCIENCE, ENGINEERING, AND TECHNOLOGY

Computers – open to all members/projects

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Use appropriate Project Description:
 - Computer Hardware Project Description (861-09)
 - Computer Programming Project Description (861-11)
 - Computer Software Application Project Description (861-13)

Electric Energy

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Electric Energy Explanation Card (862-02) – Indicate if kit was used on explanation card
- Must be labeled with member's name, county & class number
- Intermediate and Seniors include schematic diagram

GIS/GPS

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Geography Project Description (861-16)
- OR
- GIS Map Project Description (861-17)

LEGO Robotics

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- LEGO Project Description (861-19)
- OR
- Robotic Project Description (861-23)
- Please bring a photograph of your exhibit to place on display during fair

Renewable Energy

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Renewable Energy Project Description

Rocketry

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Use appropriate Project Description:
 - Aerospace-Aeronautics Project Description (861-07)
 - Rocketry Project Description

Tractor

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Include an explanation telling:
 - How the exhibit was made or what was done in the project
 - Operating instructions (if appropriate)
 - What the member learned by doing the project

Woodworking

- May enter one article or pair of articles made of wood
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Woodworking Explanation Card (871-02)

HORTICULTURE – entries due Monday, August 15

Container Gardening

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Container Garden Exhibit Information Card (716-02)
- enter only one exhibit in each class
- Each container must be labeled with member name, county, and class number on bottom of container. Put tag & card in small Ziploc bag to keep dry and attach with clear packing tape or duct tape.
- Container cannot exceed 30 lbs or measure larger than 30" x 30"
- 4-H program not responsible for condition of plant when returned

Cut Flowers

- 4-H Flower Show Exhibit Tag (4-H 0101), securely attached to the exhibit, indicate class and kind of flower
- Exhibits of cut flower types may not exceed: Jr. – 3; Int. – 4; Sr. – 5
- Check fairbook for number of blooms in each class (different in some classes)
- In an exhibit of 3 blooms, all should be the same color
- Exhibits must include foliage, but does not have to be attached
- Only one entry of each flower listed in fair book except Types, Other Perennial & Other Annual
- Do not bring or leave your own vase – vases will be provided

Flower Arrangements, fresh or dried

- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103) securely attached to the exhibit
- There are no explanation cards for Flower Arrangement exhibits
- Container must be labeled with member name, county, and class number on the bottom of the container

Herbs – Dried or Fresh Cut

- May enter one exhibit in each class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Herb Dried, Fresh-Cut Explanation Card (712-06) must be firmly attached to exhibit

Vegetables

- May enter only one plate exhibit of each vegetable except “Other” class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Vegetable Exhibit /Collections Explanation Card (712-07)
- Check Fair Book for the number of vegetables in each class (different in some classes)
- Vegetable collection exhibits must fit on a 18 ½" x 14 ½" x 2 ¾" tray.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

Art – Original

- Entry must be entirely, originally done by the member
- May enter up to five exhibits/one entry per class number
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Art Explanation Card (231-01)
- When appropriate, a plastic art hanger should be firmly affixed to the project project – available at check-in table on judging day for \$.50
- Each exhibit MUST be labeled on the back or bottom with the member’s name, county, and class number
- Exhibits should have no frames, sharp edges, or points – wood and glass frames are prohibited, matting and/or mounting are recommended for 2D art. Chalks may have a lightweight plastic frame.

Art – Non-Original

- Non-original entry includes components that have been designed or created by others
- May enter up to three exhibits/one entry per class number
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Art Explanation Card (231-01)
- When appropriate, a plastic art hanger should be firmly affixed to the project – available at check-in table on judging day for \$.50
- Each exhibit MUST be labeled on the back or bottom with the member’s name, county, and class number
- Exhibits should have no frames, sharp edges, or points - wood and glass frames are prohibited, matting and mounting are recommended for 2D art.

Leathercraft

- May enter up to three classes/one exhibit per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Leathercraft Explanation Card (251-01)
- Each exhibit will consist of one article or pair of articles.
- Each article must be labeled with name, county, & class number
- If exhibit is a pair of articles, each must be labeled and the parts attached to each other.

Cast Ceramics – Slip cast only

- May enter up to three classes/one entry per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Cast Ceramics Explanation Card (235-01)
- Exhibits must be labeled with member's name, county and class number

Fiber Arts

- May enter up to three classes / one article in each class number
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Fiber Arts Explanation Card (310-01)
- Exhibits are classed by technique that will be emphasized in judging
- Must have securely attached hanger using plastic hangers if meant to be hung – available at check-in table on judging day for \$.50

Cake Decorating Exhibit – for Expressive Arts members ONLY

- May enter up to two classes / one exhibit per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- Cake Decorating Exhibit Explanation Card (236-01)
- Each piece of the exhibit must be labeled with member's name, county, and class number
- Decorated food and board exhibits must be replaced by new items is qualified for State Fair

Other Expressive Arts – Performing Arts, General Arts (county only)

- There are no exhibit tags or explanation cards for Performing Arts
- General Arts exhibits should use the 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103) and 4-H Art Explanation Card (231-01)

CREATIVE WRITING

- One entry per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)

PHOTOGRAPHY – entries due Saturday, August 13

- One entry per class. Member may be part of one club entry. Juniors may have 4 exhibits, Intermediates may have 5 exhibits, Seniors may have 6 exhibits.
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Photography Exhibit Explanation Card (241-01)
- Exhibitor's name, address, and county should be printed on the back of the exhibit
- Photos should be mounted or matted. See class for specifics and size restrictions.
- Framing is not allowed in any class**
- No captions except classes: 241 100 11_ Series or story; 241 100 16_, Creative uses; or 241 100 17_ Scavenger Hunt
- Plastic photography hangers must be firmly attached on all exhibits project – available at check-in table on judging day for \$.50

CLOTHING & SEWING

- May enter three construction classes at same level and any of the creativity and service classes for the project level
- 4-H Sewing/Clothing Exhibit Card (320-04)**
- A label must be sewn or fused on the inside bottom of each garment/item piece. It must have the member's name (large font), county, and project level typed or printed in indelible ink on a piece of white fabric.
- To qualify for wool awards, attach a manufacturer's "all wool" (minimum 60%-100%) label, a merchant's statement indicating the fabric content, or results from a fiber content test.

KNITTING

- May enter up to four classes
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Knitting Exhibit Explanation Card (360-01)
- A label, with the member's name, county, and skill level typed or printed in indelible ink on a piece of white fabric, must be sewn or fused on each item/piece of the exhibit
- To qualify for wool awards, yarn used must be 100% wool

CROCHETING

- May enter up to three classes
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Crocheting Exhibit Explanation Card (370-01)
- A label, with the member's name, county, and skill level typed or printed in indelible ink on a piece of white fabric, must be sewn or fused on each item/piece of the exhibit
- To qualify for wool awards, yarn used must be 100% wool.

FASHION REVUE – INCLUDES CLOTHING, CREATIVE CLOTHING, KNITTING, AND CROCHET

- Exhibit limit is two garments per class/maximum of two exhibits
- 4-H Fashion Revue Card (320-06) or Creative Clothing Card (county only) ***These items will be mailed to the member along with the judging schedule in early August.***
- A 100-175 word fashion revue commentary to be read while modeling. It must be completed before being judged – it will be used both on the judging day and for the public show – see the commentary guide.
- Bring a snapshot of the member wearing the outfit. Photos will be available for a fee

HOME ENVIRONMENT

- May enter up to three classes based on unit enrolled/ one exhibit per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Home Environment Exhibit Explanation Card (340-01) securely attached to exhibit
- Each exhibit **MUST** be labeled on the back or bottom with the member's name, county, and class number

CHILD DEVELOPMENT – county only class

- May enter one class corresponding to age level
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Child Development Exhibit Explanation Card (county only) securely attached to exhibit
- Entry can be article made by member for use by/with a child or children
- Each exhibit **MUST** be labeled on the back or bottom with the member's name, county, and class number

FOODS & NUTRITION – entries due Monday, August 15

- May enter up to four classes based on phase / one exhibit per class. Only two may be food, two may be non-food exhibits.
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Exhibit Recipe Card (511-06) for all food items
- Baked goods must be displayed on a disposable plate and either covered with plastic wrap or placed in a plastic bag.
- Must be suitable for fair without spoilage or change of appearance. No fillings or toppings.
- Each recipe collection, poster, and gift basket item must be labeled with the member's name, county, and class number.
- Baked goods will not be returned Members selected for State Fair must bring new items on Sunday.
- To be eligible for Bob's Red Mill Recipe Special Award, recipe should specify the Bob's Red Mill product(s) used.

FOOD PRESERVATION

- May enter up to three classes based on phase /one exhibit per class
- 4-H Exhibit Tag (4-H 0103)
- 4-H Food Preservation Explanation Card (512-07) with complete information and instructions with recipe
- Must use OSU/USDA processing guides or Ball Blue Book 2009 or more recent
- Include jar rings on all canned products. Dried foods should be in jars or sturdy plastic bags.
- Each exhibit must be labeled with member name, county, and class number on the top or side only
- Sampled items that are kept for display will not be returned. Members are encouraged to bring a second labeled sample for display and for state entry.

WOOL FLEECES

- Place fleece in clear plastic bag with exhibitor name and county clearly written with felt marker on the lower half of the bag
- 4-H Wool Show Tag – insert in the bag so it is clearly visible
- May enter one fleece
- Fleece must have been shorn in 2011 and be from animals owned by the member
