Remember to Enroll in 4-H for 07-08 by February 1

This will be the last Monitor you will receive if you have not enrolled for the 2007-2008 4-H year. If you need enrollment forms, please stop by or call the Extension office at 572-5263 ext. 240 or check our website for the forms. All members and leaders need to re-enroll in 4-H each year. February 1 is the deadline for existing clubs to re-enroll in 4-H for the year. Members and leaders must be enrolled for the current year to be eligible for 4-H accident insurance during 4-H club meetings and countywide 4-H activities. New members may still join clubs and current members may still add projects until May 15. Animals need to be in possession and lease papers filed by May 15. Horses need to be in possession and have lease papers completed and on file by April 11th.

Printouts are being mailed to all main club leaders the week of January 14-18. These contain a list of all leaders and members that are enrolled in your club for 2007-2008. Please review these for accuracy and let us know if you find errors. Changes for State 4-H Scholarship Applications



This year there is a new application process for State 4-H scholarships and State Fair scholarships, to help simplify the application process. They will no longer be requiring a State 4-H resume as part of the scholarship application process. A two page essay will be required instead.

We are hoping that this change will increase the number of applications submitted by counties in March. Details on the new application process and requirements are available on the state 4-H website as of Jan. 1, 2008.

State and County Fair Scholarship applications will once again be due in the State 4-H office at the same time as the other Scholarship and Congress applications: March 1, 2008.

The Congress application process has not changed, and will continue to require a State 4-H resume.

National 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development

Oregon 4-H is partnering with the National 4-H Council and Tufts University to participate in the National 4-H Study of Positive Youth Development. The study is entering its 6th year, and early results are indicating that 4-H does a particularly good job of helping youth develop into healthy and contributing citizens. To date, the study does not include any 4-H youth from Oregon, but we would like to change that!!!

This year, the study will look primarily at youth who are in the 10th grade—but we can also include 8th and 9th graders as well. In January, parents of 4-H members in this age group will receive an invitation to participate in the study and parental consent form. This consent needs to be signed and returned to the State 4-H office. Once consent is received, county 4-H agents will work with the youth to set up a time to complete the survey.

A word about the survey: because of the complex nature and national scope of the study, the survey is quite long (36 pages). It will take youth about 90 minutes to complete. The study is trying to establish the impact of 4-H on positive youth behavior, but in order to do so, it needs to ask about risk behaviors as well (such as substance use and sexual behavior). We want to be sure that parents and youth understand the complete nature of the survey. Please know that these types of questions are very common in the world of adolescent research and that this survey has been used with thousands of youth without any problems.

We are excited to have Oregon represented in the study! Please

look for the study information in early January and mail parent consent forms back as soon as possible. We would like to receive all signed consent forms by January 30th. If you have any questions, please call Elissa at the OSU Extension office.

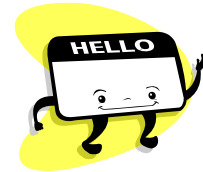

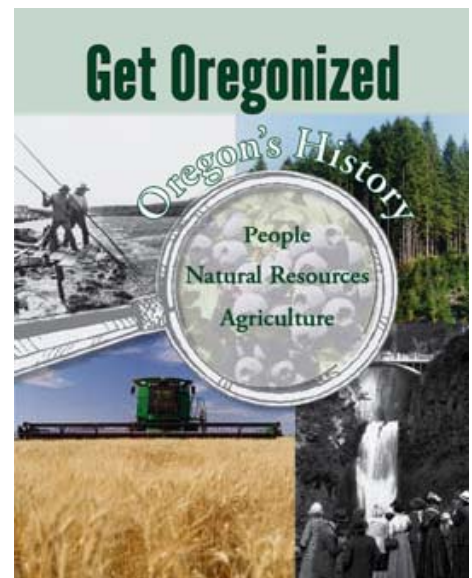

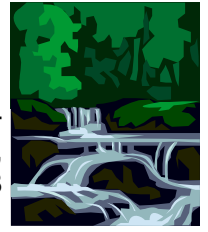
