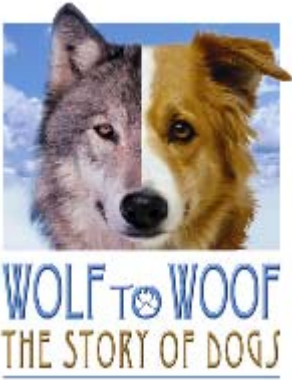

New World Forestry Center Exhibits—*Wolf to Woof: The Story of Dogs and Future Vet*

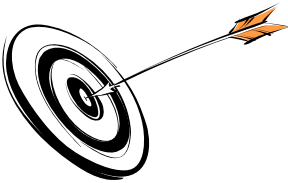

New Livestock Auction Requirements Beginning 2009

Every 4-H and FFA member (regardless of species or prior participation) planning to enter into the livestock auction program in 2009 will be required to attend at least one Auction Committee meeting during February, March or April. In addition to the member at least one parent and all leaders will need to attend also. This must be done prior to the species weigh-in date or you will not be allowed to weigh-in an animal.

The meeting dates for 2009 are February 10, March 10 and April 14. The committee members will discuss feed requirements and costs, housing needed, and health care. A general program overview and paperwork deadlines will also be covered. Questions will be answered about the program and suggestions taken for consideration.

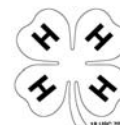
