## **Got Rebates? The Energy Trust of Oregon Does**

The Energy Trust of Oregon offers rebate-style incentives for 16 different irrigated agriculture items. One grower got a check for \$430 for replacing gaskets and will save \$900 each year in electricity savings until the gaskets wear out and need to be replaced again in five years.

If you are a PGE or Pacific Power customer with an irrigation pump and a moveable irrigation system you may be eligible for irrigation incentives for drop tubes, low pressure sprinklers, new nozzles, drains, gaskets and pipe repair.

In addition to incentives, Energy Trust can also help pay for installing a VFD on a pump, converting to a drip system, or converting from a linear or pivot to a low-pressure irrigation system using drop tubes.

## High Residue Farming Under Irrigation Workshops in Washington

WSU Extension has opened registration for High Residue Farming under Irrigation workshops to be held in Moses Lake, Pasco, Quincy, and Othello in December and January.

These workshops will cover the benefits and challenges of high residue farming, residue management, direct seeding, striptillage and the components of a high residue farming system. The workshops are for farmers in the irrigated Columbia Basin.

"High residue farming" is an umbrella term referring to cropping systems where tillage is reduced in order to maintain residue cover of the soil. Crop residue covering the soil provides the many benefits of high residue farming including savings of time, fuel, and equipment costs, decreased wind erosion, decreased water use, and improved soils.

Direct seeding (also called no-till), strip-till, and vertical tillage are all variations of high residue farming.

The speaker for the workshops will be Andy McGuire, Irrigated Cropping Systems Agronomist with WSU Extension at Ephrata.

## Growing Degrees Update

If you are curious, this is how 2013 (from January 1 to November 1) compares to previous years, for Madras, Powell Butte, Bend, and Christmas Valley (these sites represent considerable differences in elevation for comparison). The following table shows a comparison of accumulated growing degrees back to 2007 for these central Oregon locations. Three different base temperatures are used: 32 degrees F (for cereals and T-Sum N Fertilization), 41 degrees F (for alfalfa and cool season grass growth), and 50 degrees F (for grapes, corn, and warm season grass growth).

Table 1 is a accumulated growing degree comparison for 32, 41, and 50 degree F base temperatures up to November 1 for the years 2013 - 2007 at Christmas Valley, Bend, Powell Butte, and Madras, Oregon.

Table 2 is a comparison of gdd's for the month of July, 2013 and 2013 for the 4 central Oregon sites.

Table 3 is a comparison of the last frost in spring and the first fall frost dates.
