



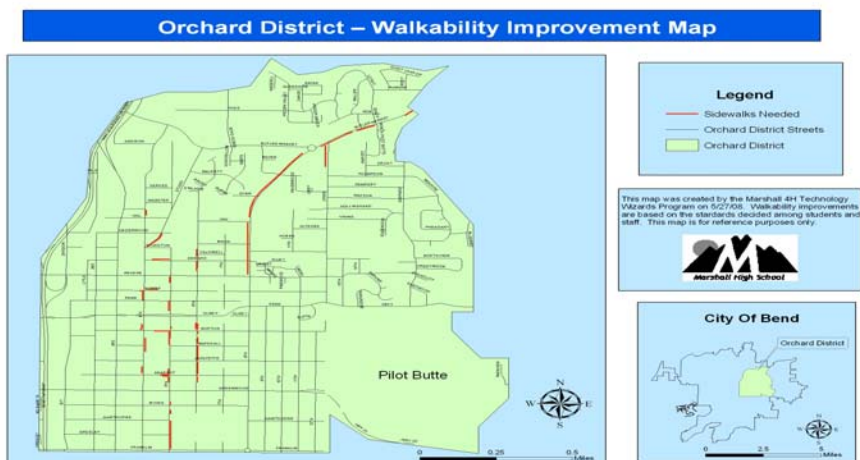

4-H Marshall Tech Wizards Receive recognition for Community Project

Skye Evans and Marty Hazeltine, members of the 4-H Marshall Tech Wizards in Bend, received top honors at Oregon State Fair in the National Geographic My Wonderful World mapping competition, receiving the Grand Champion Award.. The competition judges youth mad maps and community projects from around the state. Their project involved working with the Orchard District Neighborhood Association in Bend, Oregon to assess the walkability of the neighborhood, and designate streets that were in need of sidewalks, or in need of sidewalk repair. The youth walked or bicycled every street in the neighborhood, using GPS units to record where sidewalks were unavailable or falling apart. This data was incorporated into the map shown below. The map was then shared with the Neighborhood Association and the City of Bend. The youth also received formal recognition for the project from the Bend City Council. This years' GIS projects may include an entire City of Bend walkability analysis, a project to locate Aspen trees in Oregon, a collaborative project with the Orchard District involving shoveling snow for the elderly, and mountain biking trails in Central Oregon.

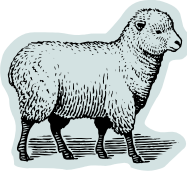

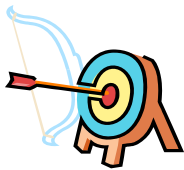

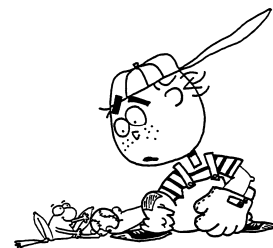

4-H Community Project

Save the Birch Volunteers Needed!

Deschutes County 4-H is starting a community partnership with Deschutes County Master Gardeners to map the birch trees within the City of Bend.

Bronze Birch Borer is a serious ornamental pest of white-barked birch. This insect will eventually kill a tree if not caught and managed early on. In particular, this is one of the most serious ornamental pests in Central Oregon. We are seeing a large decline of our white-barked birch. Many homeowners leave damaged trees in their landscape which serves as habitat for the pest to live and then move on to other susceptible birch in the area. One way to help preserve our unaffected and healthy birch is to remove those that are infested. We can do this by locating and then removing all problem birch.

The first phase of the project will involve mapping the Birch trees in the downtown area! We need help! Please come to the Deschutes County Library in Bend, on **November 15, 2008**.

Nov 15th 1:30 - 2:00 at the Deschutes County Library - Master Gardeners provide training on plant identification and disease recognition

Nov 15th - 2:00 - 5:00 - Volunteers take sections of the downtown area (particularly the area around Drake Park where there is a quantity of large Birch that is still disease free.) and collect data.

Volunteers (youth and adults welcome!) will learn how to identify the trees, identify if they are healthy or diseased, and learn how to mark them on a map.

Volunteers will then set out in groups in the downtown area to do a survey of the trees in their assigned area.

Come help make a difference in your community! This will fulfill a pre-fair requirement for community service and you may participate as an individual or as a club!

CHARACTER COUNTS!

What on Earth Were You Thinking?

Parents, have you ever asked your teen age son or daughter, what were you thinking? The answer you likely got was, “I don’t know.” Growing scientific evidence suggests your son or daughter is giving you a truthful answer. The teen age years can be trying for youth and adults. The physical, psychological, and social changes taking place in the pre adult’s world are rewarding and challenging for all involved. However, as adults, we might want to consider that the part of the adolescent brain that is capable of abstract thought and sorting out consequences to actions is not fully developed. In some cases it might not be until the age of 25 that the teenager’s frontal lobes make all the necessary connections to accommodate the cause and effect of behaviors.

So what is a parent to do? Make sure your son or daughter exercises. I am not speaking about the physical kind. Although physical health is equally important for strong adolescent development, I am referring to mental exercises that, with adult guidance, help youth to make appropriate choices. There is no better place for mental exercise than in 4-H. With the help of numerous volunteers and parents, 4-H provides youth with opportunities for mastery, independence, belonging, and generosity during this period of storm and stress.

What we do know is that families, schools, communities, and youth organizations that intentionally integrate these essential elements in the lives of youth make it possible for youth to become confident, caring, competent, connected, and character driven youth capable of contributing to society.

In other words, help your son or daughter exercise until his or her brain starts to sweat. What is good for the frontal lobes is good to a thriving teenager. djw

Shopping Carts and Rationalizations

When we think about character, we tend to think about big things like taking risks, acting with integrity, displaying generosity, or exhibiting self-sacrifice. These noble choices indicate character, but for the most part our character is revealed in much smaller events like apologizing when we’re wrong, giving to causes we believe in, being honest when it’s embarrassing, and returning shopping carts.

One of my favorite stories is about a father who asked his son to return a cart they had just used. The son protested, “C’mon, Dad, there are carts all over. No one returns them. That’s why they hire people to collect them.”

After a short argument, Mom chimed in, “For heaven’s sake, it’s no big deal. Let’s go.” Dad was about to surrender when he saw an elderly couple walking together to return their cart. After a moment, he said, “Son, there are two kinds of people in this world: those who put their carts away and those who don’t. We’re the kind who return their shopping cart. Now go put it back.”

This story isn’t just about grocery carts. It’s about doing the right thing in a world that seems to promote rationalizations and excuses that demean or trivialize simple acts of virtue. There are two kinds of people: those who find the strength to do what they ought to and those who find excuses not to.

People of character do the right thing even if no one else does, not because they think it will change the world but because they refuse to be changed by the world.

In nature there are neither rewards nor punishments—there are consequences.

From that moment on you'll also understand that more important than being your son's friend is to be a real father."

Three Basic Knitting Patterns

Worsted-weight acrylic yarns

Gauge: 5 stitches = 1 inch

Finished size: 7" by 9"

Needle size: 7 needles or size necessary to obtain gauge

GARTER STITCH

Cast on 35 stitches.

Knit every row until piece measures 9".

Bind off.

STOCKINETTE STITCH

Cast on 35 stitches.

Row 1: Knit all stitches.

Row 2: Purl all stitches.

Repeat these 2 rows until piece measures 9".

Bind off.

SEED STITCH

Cast on 35 stitches.

Row 1: Knit 1 stitch, purl the next stitch, knit the next. Continue alternating stitches across the row. Repeat this row until piece measures 9".

Bind off.

Bind off in pattern.

Three Basic Crocheting Patterns

Worsted-weight acrylic yarns

Gauge: 9 stitches = 2 inches

Finished size: 7" by 9"

Hook: Size G crochet hook or size necessary to obtain gauge

BASIC SINGLE CROCHET

Chain 30 for the foundation chain.

Row 1: Single crochet in 2nd chain from hook, and in every chain in the foundation row. Chain 1 and turn your work. Row 2: Working under the 2 top loops of each stitch in the previous row, single crochet across the row. Chain 1 and turn. Repeat Row 2 until piece measures 9". Fasten off.

BASIC DOUBLE CROCHET

Chain 27 for the foundation chain.

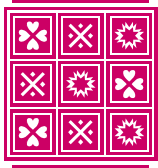
Row 1: Double crochet in 3rd chain from hook and in each chain of the foundation row. Chain 2 and turn your work. Row 2: Double crochet in each stitch across the row. Chain 2 and turn. Repeat Row 2 until piece measures 9". Fasten off.

SHELL STITCH

Chain 31 for the foundation chain. (This stitch requires multiples of 6 chains plus 1.)

Row 1: Work 3 double crochets in the 4th chain from the hook. *Skip 2 chains. Single crochet in the next chain. Skip 2 chains, then work 5 double crochets in the next chain.* (You've created your first shell.) Repeat the sequence of stitches between the asterisks (*) across the row, ending with skipping 2 chains and 1 single crochet in the last chain. Chain 3 and turn your work.

Row 2: Work 3 double crochets in the 1st single crochet. *Work 1 single crochet in the center double crochet of the next shell, work 1 shell of 5 double crochets in the next single crochet.* Repeat the sequence of stitches between the asterisks (*). End with 1 single crochet on top of the turning chain. Chain 3 and turn your work. Repeat Row 2 until piece measures 9". Fasten off.



Lap Quilts for Harmony House!

We will again be making lap quilts for the folks at Harmony House! The dates the quilts will be given has not yet been decided, but we would like to do it around Christmas if possible. The activities coordinator at Harmony House, Pam Hiatt, passed away recently and will be sorely missed. Until they have a new coordinator, we will wait to make final plans, However, don't wait to get those quilts completed! Be ready ahead of time!

There is no set pattern for the finished quilts, but I would like the finished products to measure 36" x 36", or close to it. In the past many of us have made rag-top lap quilts, which are simple, warm and relatively quick to put together, but you may use any quilt pattern you or your club would like! This community service really puts a smile on the faces of the people who receive the quilts!! Please consider making one or more quilts to donate! We will be visiting Harmony House in Dec. (Date TBD) to present our Christmas gifts! If you have questions, contact Tina! Thanks!



Ragtop Lap Quilt Pattern

You will need 36 squares for the top and 36 squares for the bottom of your quilt. You will also need 36 flannel (or heavier fabric) pieces for the batting in your quilt. (Squares are 8" x 8" square.)

Put the squares together with the bottom square wrong side up, a flannel piece for the center, then a top square right side up on top of that. You should have three squares stacked with the right sides showing on the top and bottom of the stack. Do this with all 60 squares. (1)

When you have your squares sandwiched, place them in 6 rows of 6 squares in a design you like. Place two bottom squares together, right sides facing. Sew along one side making a 1/2" seam. Add another square with the bottom right sides facing. When you have 6 squares connected, make another row. (2)

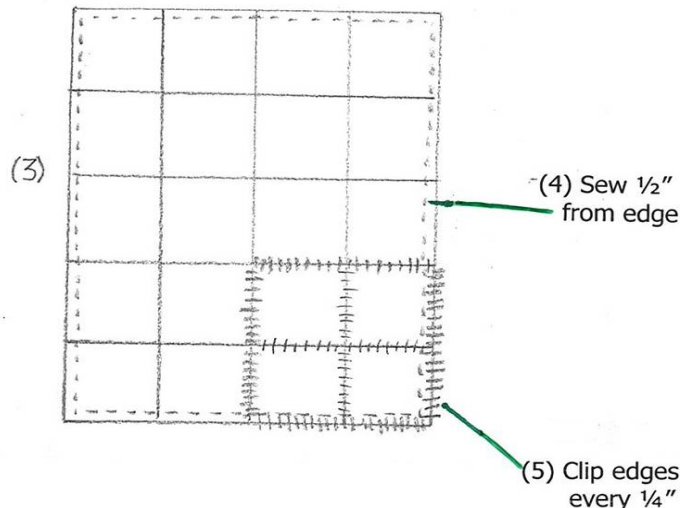
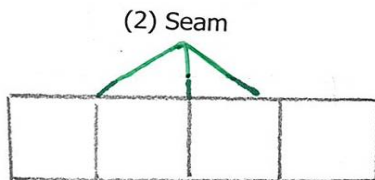
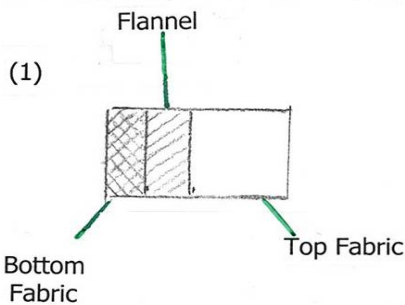
When you have completed all 6 rows, sew these together making your quilt 6 rows wide and 6 rows long. (3)

Press the seams open on the outside edges; stitch 1/2" from the edge all the way around the quilt. (4)

Clip all seams every 1/4". Be sure to keep from clipping the thread in your seam.(5)

Wash you finished quilt to fray edges. This can be messy, so you may want to use a commercial washer and dryer.

This is the visual pattern we use for skills contest, and it is smaller than the 6x6 pattern we use for Harmony House Quilts. The written instructions above are correct.

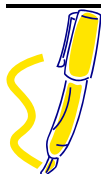

Horse Bowl

What It Is

Horse bowl is a fun event that involves youth of all ages answering questions about horses for the benefit of points. Juniors play against juniors and intermediates and seniors against other intermediate and senior members. A moderator (adult leader or parent) asks questions related to your 4-H horse materials, then as quick as you know the answer, you “buzz” in....like jeopardy, with answers instead of questions. Horse bowl is one of the most educational events we provide. It recognizes youth who spend time reading their materials and improving their horsemanship knowledge.

As a judge, numerous times I have asked youth where the “cannon bone” is? Or how much water does an average horse drink? Or what is a “coggins test?”....often, they don’t know the answer. It’s our job as horse leaders to educate 4-Hers about horses; not just how to ride, but give them knowledge they can expand and share throughout their life time. Horse bowl is an outstanding place for this to happen. It’s fun for parents too, I’ve learned a ton of stuff listening to horse bowl questions.

In addition to being a fun and learning experience, it’s also a contest. A county, state and national contest. Members compete at the county level and intermediates and seniors who qualify compete as a team at the state level and the senior winners at the state level can go to Denver to a national contest. Last year our intermediate team took first in the STATE!
