Jonathan Creach Receives Eagle Scout Honors

Jonathan Creach, a senior in High School, has been awarded the rank of Eagle Scout. This honor is the highest rank a Boy Scout can achieve. Nationally, only two percent of Scouts achieve this level of recognition. Jon worked hard to add his name to a select group of young men. He earned 21 Merit Badges, received the God and Country award, retains membership in the Order of the Arrow, and participated in Boundary Waters 100 miles canoe trip.

Jon has been active in both Scouting and 4-H since 5th Grade. His 4-H projects include Shooting, Geology, Photography, and Computers. He is a member of Teen Staff, the Program Management Advisory Committee, and takes ID pictures. He recently completed 22 hours of Challenge Course Facilitator training to meet the increasing demands of the community to access the High Desert Challenge Course.

Through 4-H, he became involved in the NRA and won a scholarship to go to Washington D.C. to the Youth Education Summit. This was the same summer he went on the Outward Bound Program.

Jon works part-time for a landscaping company in Bend, OR and takes classes at COCC. Jon, in his spare time, sleeps.

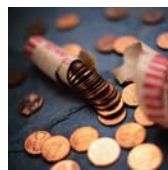

Tractor Safety Training for Youth

Farmers and ranchers who plan to hire minors under 18 years of age to operate power-driven farm machinery should be aware that minors are required to complete and pass a tractor safety training program.



To assist farmers, ranchers and minors affected by these rules, the Oregon State University Extension Service is taking reservations for its Central Oregon Farm and Tractor Safety Training and Certification Course, to be conducted in Madras at the Madras High School Vo/Ag Classroom on June 18, 19, and 20, 2007 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Class size is limited to 20 students and only for minors who will be 14 to 17 years of age during the coming agricultural season. Students need to be registered and paid up by June 15th. Cost is \$50.00.

The Deschutes County 4-H Leaders' Association and the 4-H staff are always looking for ways to communicate with 4-H families, members, and volunteers. Now, the 4-H program can send you text messages about events, activities, and deadlines at a moments notice. Ed Mobile™ is just another way we can help keep you informed. Signing up is simple.

If you wish to be on this service, just go to <http://www.ed-mobile.com> to sign up. Everyone signing on to this service will be responsible for text message fees according to your cell service provider, and there are no *additional* fees. All signing up will automatically be registered for general text messages. You will need to sign up for additional specific program areas. You may want to register ALL the cell phones in your home.

Imagine this, a meeting gets canceled because of weather AND at a moments notice, you get a text message on your cell phone letting you know. OR, an event is moved to a different building or location...zap a text message letting you know. djw

Feed Trailers & Feeding Animals at the Fair EXPECT CHANGE

We'll be trying out a new procedure at this year's fair for feed trailers. Because of the new RV park that is now where we used to park feed trailers and the traffic pattern using the road behind most livestock barns, feed trailers will now be parked either up on the hill by the north guard shack or near the Sagebrush Arena. **NO TRAFFIC WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE FAIR-GROUNDS DURING THE FAIR. NOT EVEN DURING FEED TIMES!** The only exception will be staff, judges, and superintendent vehicles.

There will be a tractor pulling a people mover from where the feed trailers are to each barn throughout the day, from approximately 5 am until 8 pm at night. This will be continuous just behind all the barns.

Those of you who want to drop kids off, will want to do that at either the small animal barn gate or the guard shack by the horse barn; again, you will NOT be able to drive in.

We will also try to make room in the barns where space is available to keep some feed inside. (This will probably not be possible in the goat and pig barn and maybe not in the beef barn)

Prepare your clubs and 4-Hers and most importantly their families for this major change. Frankly, I think once we've tried it a bit, this will work out very well. More details will come...ccb

Market Animal Weight Requirements

At fair animals should weigh (lbs):

Hogs: 225-275 (10 lb increase in upper weight)

Turkeys (Toms): 18-25

Turkeys (Hens): 14-24

Rabbit: 4.5-6

Life Lessons from a Professional Model

Our modeling workshop was a great success!! Besides learning how to “walk the runway”, Pam Bronson shared some life lessons she has learned while modeling over the years. For those of you who missed the workshop, I want to share some of her thoughts and suggestions, as written in her outline:

Pam’s 6 Survival Life Choices:

1.) **Attitude** is everything- how is your attitude? Are you negative? Stubborn? Proudful? Self-centered? Never think you are wrong? *OR* are you kind, gentle, patient, positive, role with the punches?? Do you help around the house without grumbling? Do

you make people feel good or are you abrasive? You can choose your attitude...

Charles Swindol wrote:

The longer I live, the more I realize the impact of ATTITUDE on life. ATTITUDE, to me, is more important than facts. The remarkable thing is we have a choice every day regarding the ATTITUDE we will embrace for that day. We cannot change our past...we cannot change the fact that people will act in a certain way. We cannot change the inevitable. The only thing we can do, is play on the one string we have and that is our ATTITUDE. I am convinced that life is 10% what happens to me and 90% how I react to it.

2.) **A Compassionate Heart** is “part” of having a good attitude by showing love to everyone, being quick to listen and slow to speak, and by trying NOT to be self-centered.

3.) **Exercise** ..you have to make it a habit- it makes you feel good about yourself and is good for you... it is life changing ...after a while you crave it. Try walking everyday for 30 minutes... even if is raining or snowing...And while you’re at it summer, winter, everyday....wear Sunscreen...

4.) **Sunscreen** just wear it...spray it on ...it may save your life and prevent wrinkles down the road Don’t let your skin burn-that is solo bad for you

You can get a great tan with SPF 15

5.) **Nutrition** – good eating habits are a choice and a “life change”...This is one of my passions .. You are what you eat... If you start the day off with a bagel or a donut, you are going to crave more carbs like these empty calories and you will be hungry all day...possibly leading to over eating. The best way is to eat a low sugar cereal with nonfat milk and this will fill you up and sustain you, while giving you the protein and other nutrients that you need. Eat at least 3-4 small nutritional meals per day...never starve yourself. This really messes up your metabolism. Of course, drink lots and lots of water.

Pretend your body is an expensive car. You want to take care of this fine machine by only putting the best products into it, so it will run smoothly and not break down and run with optimum performance.

6.) Our final survival life choice is.....**Never Go to Bed With a Dirty Face**...

Wash your face before bed. This is extremely important especially when you start wearing make-up.

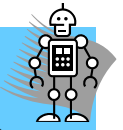

Non-Livestock Silent Auction at the Fair!

Because of the reallocation of premium money this year, and a desire to promote more than just livestock projects, we are going to try having a silent auction for non-animal items at the just prior to the livestock auction, during the buyers barbecue at the Event Center. This will give 4-H members who are part of non-animal projects a chance to raise a little money to invest back into their projects and also an opportunity to promote those non-livestock projects to a new group of community members. Each exhibitor will be allowed to enter one item, or one basket of items to the silent auction (cookies, a hat and scarf set, homemade jam and biscuits, photographs, etc. depending on your project area). If you're already selling an animal, you will not be eligible. When the item sells Kiwanis will handle the funds and 4% of the proceeds will be retained by them, 3% held in trust for 4-H/FFA youth and 1% being returned to the 4-H Leaders Association to fund the buyers bbq, just as they do with the market animal proceeds.

Exhibitors are encouraged to make their item high quality and attractive to the buying public. Auction items will need to be approved by the 4-H staff before being allowed into the sale. We want to showcase our non-animal 4-Hers in a positive way! There will be more information about this at the General Fair Meeting on June 21st in the N. Sister Bldg. at 6:30 pm. We will also discuss it at the Home Ec./Expressive Arts Committee Meeting June 26th, 6:30 at the Extension office. Sign-ups for entering an item in the auction will be the same as your fair entries; July 1st. This is a totally new idea, so we will be fine tuning the process as we go through it this year. According to a story popularized by author Stephen Covey, a teacher put a large jar on her desk and next to it a bag of rocks. She filled the jar with the rocks. When she was done, she asked the class if the jar was full.

"Yes," they declared.

The teacher took out a sack of gravel and dumped it into the jar, filling the spaces between the rocks. "Is the jar filled now?" she asked. "Yes," the students responded.

The teacher then produced a bag of sand and poured it into the jar, shaking it until the spaces between the rocks and gravel were filled. "What life lesson can we learn from this?" she asked. 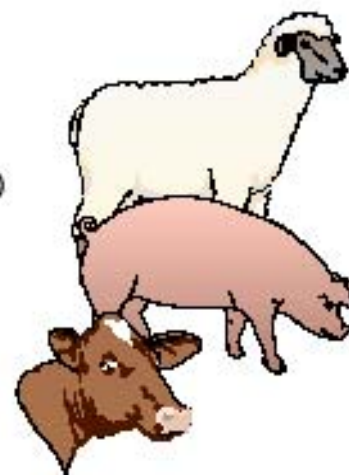

- Any industry/association local, national or state workshop or seminar pertinent to the 4-Hers species
- Club Community Service
- 4-H Camp
- 4-H Workshop Series or Educational day related to 4-Hers species.
- Completion of an advancement step in chosen species or project area. i.e.: Rabbit advancement
- Jackpot/breed/association show (helping, exhibiting or as a spectator)
- Presentation to the club w/a written report

If you have questions about something else qualifying, contact Candi. Essentially, these are outside of club events or events open to anyone to participate. ccb

Dog Show Etiquette

- When at any dog show, you need to use common courtesy. Everyone deserves respect for themselves and for their property;
- put yourself into another's shoes. How would you like it if something unpleasant were done to you or your dog?
- no running around, screaming or yelling;
- no hanging over the show ring. Stay at least 5 feet back from ring;
- no eating right next to the show ring. Food is a very big distraction for some dogs;
- no drilling your dogs on the show grounds. That means no extensive training. You may heel your dog – warming him up is okay;
- take your dog to the exercise area to potty;
- **CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG!** Some shows will take ribbons, trophies, and awards away from those who do not clean up after their dog. Always carry a plastic baggy to clean up dog poop;
- throw away any garbage that you may have left. Pick up after yourself;

- clean up after you do any grooming. Don't let your dog's hair blow around;
- ask the owner if it would be okay if you pet their dog *before* you do so;
- provide fresh, clean water at all times for your dog;
- if you feed your dog, make sure you pick up what he does not eat;
- keep dog food away from other dogs to avoid any dogfights. This includes treats and bones;
- offer to help clean up, pack up, carry stuff for the organizers of the show site. There is a lot of work that goes into running a dog show, and the organizers would love some help at the end of a long day!
- always thank each one of your judges before the day is over. Also, when talking to your judge (s) or show organizers always use "Sir" and "Ma'am;" and if you have any questions for the judge, wait until the judge is done judging before you ask them.
