I know one of his recent thoughts is to create a DVD for youth, parent, and volunteers to help navigate them through the first year of 4-H.

You will see a lot of Houston in the future. His ambition is to be a 4-H agent. I can't think of a better county for him to learn the ropes. As parents, members, and volunteers, you will be his greatest teachers.

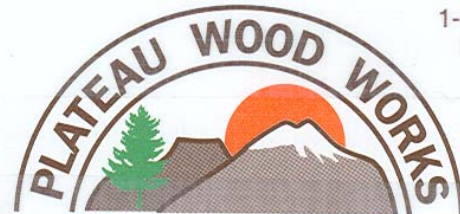

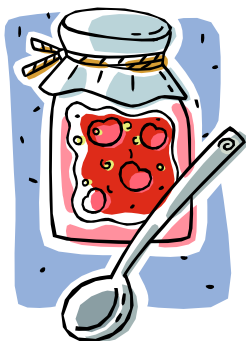

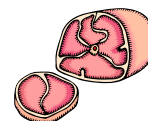

## Master Showmanship An Important Tradition and a Whole Lot of Fun!

For those who don’t know, the master Showmanship contest is a contest usually held on Saturday morning. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion showman from each of the following species participate: Llama, Horse, Swine, Dairy Cow, Sheep, Beef, four total goats from either fiber, meat, dairy, or pygmy.

Each member, once they realize they will be participating, goes to each barn asking members how to show all the specific species, they borrow the 4-H project materials on each species to gather information, and they ask other 4-Hers for practice showing each species.

Then these members bring their own animal to the ring prepared for show and each dresses the showmanship part. Then they spend 4 minutes demonstrating their showmanship skills on each animal present (6-8 minutes per species). As they rotate, the fun escalates as 4-Hers begin to show animals they are unfamiliar with or have less knowledge of. It’s a very fun contest to watch and most participants enjoy the time as well...even though they have to get ready for showmanship, AGAIN.

So, remember for future reference...If you receive Grand or Reserve Grand in showmanship, it’s a requirement of that award to be present and participate in the master showmanship contest. It’s a requirement of the honor.

## **Biosecurity Tips: Protect Your Flock from Avian Influenza.**

### **You are the best protection your birds have**

#### **1. Keep Your Distance.**

Restrict access to your property and your birds. Consider fencing off the area where your birds are to form a barrier between “clean” and “dirty” areas. The clean area is the immediate area surrounding your birds, and the dirty or buffer area must be considered to be infected with germs, even if the birds appear healthy and disease free.



Allow only people who take care of your birds to come into contact with them. Your caretakers should not attend bird shows or other events where birds are present. If visitors to your property want to see your birds, be sure they wash up first and clean their shoes. Better yet, keep clean boots for visitors to wear. If your visitors have birds of their own, do not let them near your birds at all.

Game birds and migratory waterfowl should not have contact with your flock because they can carry germs and diseases. If your birds are outdoors, try to keep them in a screened area.

#### **2. Keep It Clean.**



You wouldn't think of tracking dirt and disease into your house, where it could infect your family. Don't do that to your birds either! Germs can be picked up on shoes and clothing and moved from one area to another. To keep your birds “germ-free,” keep a pair of shoes and a set of clothes to wear only around your birds. Many people keep these clean clothes in a covered pail at the entrance to their bird area. Or, clean and disinfect your shoes and launder your clothes before you check on or work with your birds.

Scrubbing your shoes with a long-handled scrub brush and disinfectant (see section below on disinfectants) will remove droppings, mud, or debris. Clothes should be washed in a washing machine with laundry detergent.

Keep cages, food, and water clean on a daily basis. Clean and disinfect equipment that comes in contact with your birds or their droppings. That includes tools such as feed

scoops, shovels, rakes, and brooms. All manure must be removed before disinfectant can work, so clean surfaces with soap and water first.

### **3. Don't Haul Disease Home.**

Car and truck tires, poultry cages, and equipment can all harbor "germs." If you travel to a location where other birds are present, or even to the feed store, be sure to clean and disinfect these items before you return to your property.

Taking some of your birds to a fair or exhibition? Keep those birds separated from the rest of your flock and watch them for at least 2 weeks after the event to ensure that they didn't pick up a disease.

New birds should be kept separate from your flock for at least 30 days before putting them with the rest of your birds. To prevent disease, it is best not to mix young and old birds or birds from different species or different sources.

### **4. Don't Borrow Disease From Your Neighbor.**



Do not share birds, lawn and garden equipment, tools, or poultry supplies with your neighbors or other bird owners. If you do bring these items home, clean and disinfect them before they reach your property. And remember to clean and disinfect borrowed items before returning them. Never share items such as wooden pallets or cardboard egg cartons because they are porous and cannot be adequately cleaned and disinfected.

### **5. Know the Warning Signs of Avian Influenza.**

Many bird diseases can be difficult to diagnose. The list below includes some of the things to look for that signal something might be wrong with your birds. Early detection of signs is very important to prevent the spread of disease.

- Sudden death
- Lack of energy and appetite
- Decreased egg production and/or soft-shelled, misshapen eggs
- Sneezing, nasal discharge or coughing
- Swelling or purple discoloration of the wattles, combs, and legs
- Diarrhea
- Lack of coordination, complete paralysis



### **6. Report Sick Birds.**



Do not wait to report unusual signs of disease or unexpected deaths among your birds. Call your local veterinarian or the State Veterinarian's office at 503-986-4680. There is no charge for state

**You are the best protection your birds have**

veterinarians to work with you to conduct a disease investigation. Early reporting is important to protecting the health of your birds!

### Disinfectants

Cleaning and disinfecting is one of the most important steps you can take in practicing backyard biosecurity. Below are some examples of disinfectants available on the market. Follow the directions on the label carefully for the best results.

Thoroughly clean and scrub objects before applying disinfectants. Disinfectants cannot work on top of caked-on dirt and manure, so thoroughly wash surfaces before disinfecting.

Apply disinfectants using brushes, sponges and spray units. Allow adequate contact time (follow manufacturer's instructions.)

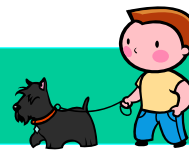
Dispose of used disinfectant according to local regulations.

### Examples of Disinfectants

- Roccal®: Mix 1 fluid oz of Roccal per gallon of water.
- Nolvasan® (chlorhexidine diacetate 2 percent): Mix 3 fluid oz of Nolvasan per gallon of water.
- Household bleach (sodium hypochlorite 6 percent): Mix 1 cup of household bleach per gallon of water.
- Lysol® spray for footwear
- Purell® hand pump for hand disinfection

# Farm Safety Tips

## ATV Safety

ATVs are a common source of accidents on farms. ATVs have become popular for work and recreation on many farms and ranches. Unfortunately, reported cases of serious injury and death have increased along with their increased use. Most of these injuries and deaths can be attributed to improper use of ATVs. Make ATV safety a priority on your farm or ranch.

### **Here are some safety tips from the National Safety Council's Agricultural Division:**

#1 An ATV is not a toy. Children should not be permitted to operate ATVs without specialized training and then they should be allowed to only operate an ATV of an appropriate size. Contact the ATV Safety Institute at <http://www.atvsafety.org/> to enroll in a course.

#2 ATVs with an engine size of 70cc to 90cc should be operated by people at least 13 years of age.

#3 ATVs with an engine size of greater than 90cc should only be operated by people at least 16 years of age

#4 Wear appropriate riding gear: DOT-, Snell ANSI-approved helmet, goggles, gloves, over-the-ankle boots, long-sleeve shirt and long pants.

#5 Read owners manuals carefully.

#6 ATVs are not made for multiple riders. Never carry anyone else on the ATV.

#7 Any added attachments affect the stability, operating and braking of the ATV. Just because an attachment is available doesn't mean that it can be used without increasing your risk of being injured.

#8 Do not operate the ATV on streets, highways or paved roads.

### **INSPECTION**

#1 Are tires and wheels in good condition?

#2 Are controls and cable operational?

#3 Does the chain have proper slack and is it lubricated? Is there a chain guard?

#4 Is riding gear (including a helmet) available and worn?

## Falls from Tractors and Trailing Equipment

This past winter another tragic accident claimed the life of a girl who fell off a moving tractor. Please take a moment to read these tips from the National Safety Council's Agricultural Division.

Runovers caused by falls from tractors and trailing equipment are one of the most common forms of unintentional injuries that happen on the farm or ranch. Many of these lead to serious injury and death. Falls from farm machinery are particularly common for the older farmer and children. Falls from machinery can be prevented by adopting these basic practices:

#1 Wear shoes and boots with slip-resistant soles and heels.

#2 Keep platforms, foot-plates and steps clear of mud, snow, manure or other debris.

#3 Before moving, check the tractor and trailing equipment to see that no one has climbed aboard without your knowledge.

#4 Remove tools or other items that may cause a tripping hazard from the operator platform.

#5 Do not use working farm equipment as a place to baby-sit children. Arrange for proper childcare.

#6 Never allow anyone to ride on the drawbar or towed machinery.

#7 Insist that no one ride on farm equipment except those required for its operation, instruction, or diagnostics.

#8 Reduce speed on rough, uneven or hilly ground.

#9 Watch for obstacles.

#10 Wait for the tractor to stop before getting off. Set brakes and step down using handholds or rails.

#11 If your tractor doesn't have a Rollover Protective Structure (ROPS), get one.
