Watch for major changes in your newsletter. As of October, you will no longer find event registration materials in the *Over the Clover* newsletter. Instead, you will find events listed with website addresses. All you will need to do is go to the website and sign up or print off a registration and send it in to the designated address.

The newsletter itself will continue (for now) with major changes to policy and human interest articles about our program. This new look will evolve with your input. The *new* newsletter will be either Emailed or “snail” mailed to you depending on your preference at the time of enrollment. If you aren't ready to re-enroll yet, but are ready to receive your newsletter online or via Email, just drop Reaza a note and let her know.

At this time, it is critical we have your Email address correct and if you don't have web access or Email, that you never hesitate to call us and ask us to fax or drop something in the mail for you. We are happy to accommodate you. You should also expect more frequent Emails from us – as events become solid, we'll Email notice and registration links – studies show most prefer small bits of information frequently rather than 36 page newsletters once per month. Let us know what works and what doesn't as we begin this new technological phase.

In addition to our newsletter, both Tina and I have face book pages and so does teen staff. We'll be exploring various ways to use this social networking as well. AND, I'm going to try and be faithful to a weekly or biweekly 4-H Update, sending out Email with what's happening. Let me know how you think it's going! Ccb

New Enrollment Fee Structure

If members enroll and pay fees by **Wednesday, January 20**, 5 p.m. the first two family members will be \$40.00 each.

If members enroll and pay fees between **Thursday, January 21 and Monday, March 15**, 5 p.m. the first two family members will be \$50.00 each.

If members enroll and pay fees between **Tuesday, March 16 and Tuesday June 1**, 5 p.m. the first two family members will be \$60.00 each.

In all cases, the third and additional family members fees will be \$25.00 each.

Any member enrolling **after Tuesday, June 1** will **NOT** be eligible to compete at County or State fair. All members enrolling after this date will be charged \$60.00 each. There will not be a break for additional family members.

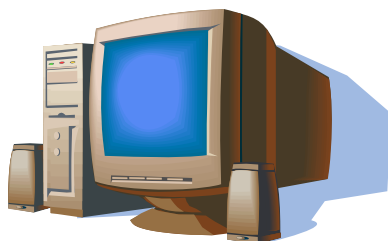

Sisters Area Computer Club Up and Running

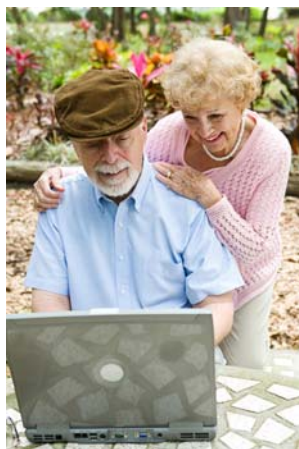
Did you know that there was a Deschutes

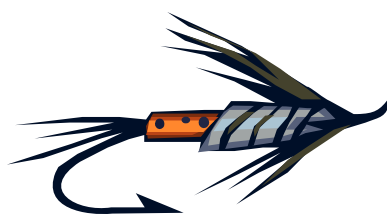
