TERMS OF THE AWARD

1. Applicant must be currently enrolled in a 4-H or FFA livestock project.
2. Applicant must be 11 years or older and have at least one year of experience in a 4-H or FFA livestock program.
3. Application will consist of:
 - 1) Current years records which ended September 30 (assembled according to respective guidelines).
 - 2) Short essay which includes the following:
 - a. Give reasons for wanting the heifer.
 - b. Facilities for her care.
 - c. Future plans for you and the heifer.
 - d. Past history of your 4-H or FFA projects.
4. Winner must agree to exhibit the heifer at next year's Douglas County Fair.
5. Winner will be announced at the 4-H Recognition Festival, and winner must try to locate animal within 90 days after receiving the award.
6. Winners of this award shall write a letter and send a photo of the animal to the sponsor. The 4-H winner is encouraged to join a 4-H livestock club. The award winner must notify the 4-H Awards Committee if they are unable to accept the award, if they must give it up or if they move from the area.
