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- May 5, 2008 Codling moth traps have no moths. Do not spray yet. Wait until the trap gets 5 moths within one week before spraying.
- May 12, 2008 Codling moth trap catch jumped to 4 moths on Sunday. You can hold off a little longer.
- May 19, 2008 Codling moth count jumped to huge numbers following our hot spell with three days over 100 degrees. Make sure you spray this week. Some recommended products for homeowners are Spinosad, Kaolin clay, horticultural oil, or malathion. No sign of apple scab in the orchard is probably due to the dry weather pattern the past few weeks. Apple maggot will not be around in the orchard until late July.
- May 26, 2008 Apple scab starting to appear in unsprayed trees as a cool damp week arrived in late May. I would advise putting on fungicide cover sprays for apples, crabapples.
- June 2, 2008 One Codling moth in traps this week. No need to spray.
- June 9, 2008 One more Codling moth caught in traps this week. No need to spray. Apple scab problems minimal.
- June 16, 2008 Still have not seen the second flight of Codling moth. Warm dry temperatures making apple scab less likely.
- June 23, 2008 On Saturday, June 21, I caught 7 Codling moths. It is time to spray your second spray to control the moths. The new traps I am using this year attract both male and female moths so I am able to know when the females are present. In the past the pheromone only attracted the males. This is why my total moth catches are larger this year.
- June 30, 2008 Codling moth counts in traps are once again stable after cleaning out traps from last week. We have seen a single moth in some of the traps. We have seen a few filbert worm moths caught in one trap. Spraying for filbert worm can be done in the week ahead.
- July 7, 2008 No new codling moths have been trapped. There is no reason to spray at this time. I have not caught any more filbert worms. So spraying can wait.
- July 14, 2008 No catches for codling moth, filbert worm or walnut husk fly
- July 21, 2008 Caught two codling moth adults this week. No need to spray. Caught one new filbert worm adult, no need to spray yet. No walnut husk fly caught this week.

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- July 28, 2008 Caught two new filbert worm moths. This is a good time to spray filberts. No walnut husk flies caught this week. No new codling moths in our traps.
- August 4, 2008 We caught 2 codling moth this week. No need to spray now but when we get 5 moths in one week we will spray again. Our walnut husk fly trap caught 2 flies this week. When we have 3 days in succession with increasing fly numbers we will direct our first spray. That may hit later this week. Stay in touch. It is common to have a second spray in late August. Our filbert worm trap had 2 more flies this week. Go ahead and spray the filberts if you did not do it last week. No need to do it again if you sprayed last week.
- August 11, 2008 No more filbert worm moths in our traps. We did see another small flight of Codling moth adults in traps. We caught 4 moths this week. A final application of Spinosad can be used. We did get an increase in walnut husk flies over a 3 day period this week. That is a good signal to apply either Spinosad or Malathion to your trees.
- August 18, 2008 No additional pests in traps this week.
- August 25, 2008 No additional pests in traps this week.
- September 2, 2008 Trap monitoring is ceasing for the season as filberts, walnuts, apples, pears are past serious pest outbreak points.

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
