Oregon Biosecurity/BVD-PI Screening Program is designed to improve the overall health of Oregon's cow herd and add value to the state's calf crop. The project will provide technical assistance and limited financial support to all Oregon ranchers who want to screen their cattle for persistent infection (PI) with bovine viral diarrhea (BVD) virus. This program is also designed to provide ranchers with the tools and expertise to create a written biosecurity plan.

"The focus of this project is to assist ranchers in improving their bottom dollar by improving herd health," said Barbi Riggs, Central OR Livestock Agent for OSU and the project's manager. The project is supported by the OSU Dept. of Animal Sciences and College of Veterinary Medicine and is funded through the OR Beef Council and Ag Research Foundation of Oregon.
