## Camp Staff

4-H Camp is facilitated by the faculty and staff of the OSU Extension Service—Lane County and Metro Area 4-H Programs, along with help from wonderful 4-H volunteers. Our kitchen staff can accommodate special dietary needs. 4-H Camp also has a qualified person on site who is available to administer basic first aid.

4-H Camp counselors are 4-H members and other young adults who are specially selected and trained to work with youth.

## Facilities

The Lane County 4-H Camp is held at the beautiful 4-H Center located in the Eola Hills outside Salem. The center sits on 300 acres of mixed forests, meadows, and ponds. Buildings on the property include cabins and cottages to house campers, full shower and restroom facilities, a dining lodge, various learning shelters, and an amphitheater. The center also has an in-ground swimming pool, and a large pond for canoeing and fishing.



## Who Can Go?

4-H Camp is open to all youth who completed 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade in 2010. There is no 4-H membership requirement to attend camp. We do require a willingness to have fun, make friends, and learn new things!

## Transportation

Round-trip bus transportation from Eugene is included in the registration fee. The bus leaves on Monday morning, August 16<sup>th</sup> and returns campers on Friday afternoon, August 20<sup>th</sup> to the OSU Extension Service in Lane County, 950 W 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Eugene. Specific drop off & pick-up times will be provided to all campers in their confirmation packet.

**Reserve your spot by Monday, July 26, 2010!**  
The registration fee of \$250 must be paid in full by **August 9, 2010**. A minimum of \$150 is required at the time of registration, to reserve your spot.

After registration, campers will receive a letter with more information about what to bring, arrival and departure times, and how to communicate special diets, and much more.
