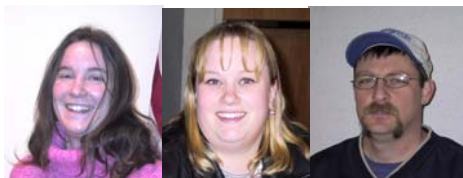

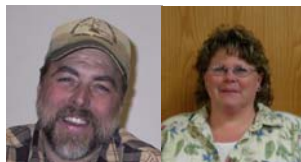

All Goat Division Rules

- Members must check-in with the Goat Superintendents Tuesday, July 13, between 9 am and 9 pm.
- A health check will be done at check in. Animals with signs of disease, other potential health problems, or unsightly conditions will not be allowed to enter. Animals will also be checked for Scrapie tags/tattoos and horns.
- All goats must be Scrapie tagged or tattooed. No goats with horns or large scurs will be allowed at fair with the exception of Meat Does, or Angora, and Cashmere Goats.
- No does that have kidded after July 1, 2009 or bred does due before Aug. 30, 2009 will be allowed at fair.
- Only goats being shown in classes will be allowed at fair with the exception of kids born after June 1, 2009 who are nursing an entered doe. Nursing **bull** kids born before July 1, 2009 need Superintendent's approval prior to fair registration.
- Exhibitors bringing kids to fair must take proper precautions (i.e. poultry wire, etc.) to keep them confined to their pen.
- Exhibitors are required to participate in the Showmanship classes that correspond to their project(s).
- Members may not enter more than **8 breeding goats and 2 market goats** at fair. This can be a combined total of any of the divisions, but no more than 2 entries per class.

MEAT GOATS

Rules

1. Required to follow rules listed for All Goat Divisions in addition to the following rules.
2. Exhibitors may enter 2 market goats, but only one market goat will be sold at auction. Market records must be kept on both animals and submitted during fair weigh-in.
3. Members with 2 market goats must notify the Superintendent by 9 pm on Wednesday, which animal sells in the auction.
4. Clipping Meat does is optional. Market/feeder goats must be body clipped.
5. We strongly recommend all meat goats be dehorned. Horns or scurs are only allowed in breeding doe classes, and only if they are tipped or capped.
6. Market/feeder goats must be dehorned and have no scurs.
7. Horned does can not be shown in the 4-H Meat Goat Showmanship classes.

795 300 000 Market Goat

1. Must weigh at least 60 lbs. on Tuesday of fair week. They must weigh less than 80 lbs. at the May weigh-in. There is no top weight limit at fair.
2. Must have at least .15 lb. ADG between the May and July weigh-in to sell at auction.
3. Sex may be either doe or wether.
4. Market animals must be body clipped and be less than 1 year old at fair.

5. Animals must be castrated and dehorned by the May weigh-in.

Rules

- Required to follow rules listed for All Goat Divisions in addition to the following rules.
- Members entering Dairy Wethers may enter no more than **2 dairy wethers**.
- Members entering Pygmy Wethers may enter no more than **4 pygmy wethers**.
- Members entering Pack Goats may enter no more than **1 pack goat**.
- Pack goats may be a wether or dry/unbred doe of any breed or crossbred. Exhibitor must participate in the Showmanship class of the breed most closely resembling the Pack goat entry.
- Dairy goats must be body clipped. Clipping Pack goats is optional.
- All milking does must be milked between 8:00 pm and 10:00 pm the day prior to their show. Milk must be disposed of in the proper, marked location.
- Fiber Goats include Pygora, Angora, and Cashmeres.
- When showing Fiber goats, you may also bring a handful of winter or spring fleece in a sandwich bag along with your animal when you enter the show ring for confirmation class. Please leave the animal in full fleece at the time of the show if possible.

1. 4-H members must be enrolled in a project relating to the contest they are entering.
2. Ribbons will be awarded on individual scores. In addition, judging team ribbons (blue, red and white) will be awarded to all members (up to five) of the three highest scoring judging teams in each contest. Each team may have a maximum of five (5) members, but team scores will be calculated using the top three individual scores from each team. All teams competing must have a minimum of three members. Team ribbons and team placings will not be awarded to teams with fewer than three members.
3. No talking is allowed by 4-H members after the contest has begun. If 4-H members have a question regarding the contest, the member should address that question to the group leader. 4-H members will be given one warning for talking. The next offense will result in the member receiving a zero for that class. Subsequent violations will result in the member being dismissed from the contest and receiving a zero for all classes. Decisions regarding compliance with this rule rest with the group leader.
4. To facilitate greater participation, counties may wish to combine members so a team representing several counties may participate in the judging contests at State Fair. A hard copy entry form available in the State Fair Handbook, must be filled out with the participants' names, coach's name, county and approving agent signature of the county Extension Agent in each county.
5. Contestants will judge beef, sheep and swine.

2. All tack will be in tack stalls assigned in club sections. No hay bales in the aisles.
3. Members may not enter more than 9 animals.
4. Market animal may be crossbred and not counted as a third breed.
5. There must be three or more animals of a breed to constitute a breed division.
6. Animals must have been washed and preliminary clipping must be done prior to Fair, except long wool breeds.
7. Market lambs cannot be shown in breeding classes except as ewe and produce.

HERDSMANSHIP

All clubs/independents, regardless of number of entries, are eligible to compete for herdsmanship awards. Herdsmanship is based on:

1. **4-H Members**, appearance, friendliness, courtesy, conduct, cooperation and work done by members.
2. **Animals**, securely tied or penned, clean and comfortable, regularly fed and cared for.
3. **Exhibit Area**, alleys, stalls and pens attractive for audience, feed and equipment safely stored, stall cards displayed and filled out, fitting stands and blocking chutes clean and neat. Hay bales **are not** allowed in the aisles, except in dairy and beef areas.
4. **Educational Displays**. An extra 10 points can be gained from an Educational Display. The display should be a poster or small collection of items. It should show an animal related topic, and be easy for anyone passing by to understand. All displays should be on poster board or laminated to hold up for the whole fair. Creating an educational display for the barn is optional this year, but all clubs are encouraged to participate.
