

# SMALL ANIMALS

## CATS

1. Read Animal Science Rules and Health Requirements.
2. Cats may be inspected by the veterinarian in duty at the Exhibit Area before proceeding to the cat display area. Cats which show evidence of fleas, ear mites or other contagious conditions will be immediately sent home. Cats with unclipped claws will not be allowed to show.
3. Two cats per exhibitor may be shown.
4. 4-H members attire should be neat, clean and modest when showing their cat. Long sleeved shirts or blouses are required.
5. Cats will not be allowed to enter the fairgrounds except for Wednesday, July 15, and only in a travel carrier or suitable confinement. Large dog travel carriers are acceptable for use as a cage at fair, but NOT the small ones. Comfortable space for the cat, plus room for litter pan, and water and feed dishes are required.
6. Cats must be kept in their show cages, except when being shown or during herdsmanship when the cat may be out of the cage but must be under the control of the 4-H member. All cats must be in a cat 'H' harness at all times, even while caged.
7. All cats must be vaccinated for rabies and panleukopenia (distemper) at least 30 days before the show (no later than May 21, 2010). A certificate must contain the vaccination date, the specific vaccination given, and a brief identifying description of the cat's appearance and be signed by an adult. Kittens under 6 months of age will not be required to have a rabies vaccination.
8. A kitten must be at least 4 months old at the time of show. Kittens are those cats between the ages of 4 and 8 months. Cats over 8 months are considered adults.
9. Basis for judging: Appearance of member, appearance of cat, knowledge of cats and cat health and care, and how the cat is handled. All cats which meet the health and age requirements, regardless of breeding, will be eligible.

## POULTRY

FFA:

1. Each exhibitor will be limited to two entries in each class and a total of 10 poultry entries (includes waterfowl, chickens and pigeons), plus one dozen eggs.
2. 4-H poultry members will be required to be present to show their birds. Each member will carry their exhibit to the judge's table and show them while they are being judged.
3. Eggs will not be sold at the auction.
4. Only pens of 3 market broilers/fryers and ducklings can be sold. Only pens of 1 market turkey or goose can be sold. These birds must be weighed by the poultry superintendent at time of check-in.
5. Exhibitors report to area superintendent at time of arrival
6. Poultry must be health checked and weighed at time of arrival on fairgrounds.
7. Breeds in the American Poultry Association (APA) Class are based on those birds found exclusively in the APA book titled, *Standards of Perfection*. The Non-Standard class would include birds found in standards other than the APA Standard like the British or Japanese Standards. Birds known by the exhibitor to be of a crossbred origin should be entered in the crossbred class. Birds that have been raised as a result of those strains distributed as a result of the Oregon 4-H Incredible Egg Program or the Oregon Broiler Growers Youth Contest should be entered in the commercial category.
8. All exhibitors must participate in showmanship in each project area entered.
9. It is recommended that all birds be banded.
10. 4-H/FFA poultry will be released Sunday. Checkout and clean up will be on Sunday from 6:00 p.m. - 8 p.m. See the Poultry superintendent before leaving with any of your poultry. Exhibitors may remain to show open class on Sunday. If you have poultry already entered in the 4-H show that is also entered in the Sunday open show, you may move the birds into other cages at checkout Saturday instead of taking them home and back that night. See the 4-H Poultry superintendent for these arrangements.

## RABBITS

 FFA:

1. Each participant must obtain health check from health superintendent before caging! Rabbits must be clean and fitted before bringing to fair. Sick or dirty animals will not pass the health check. Animals with obvious disqualification's may be turned away. This is only a safety check for any visible disease. We do not pre-judge the rabbit. That is the responsibility of the judge on show day.
2. Show animals must be at least 3 months old (except fryers). Display animals must be no younger than 4 weeks old.
3. 4-H members must own their animals, have possession of them by June 1<sup>st</sup> and be present to show their rabbits. Each member will carry their rabbit to the judging table and show them while they are being judged.
4. Permanent I.D. is recommended.
5. Rabbits will be judged in their breed classes based on condition, conformation and the ARBA standard. All judges placings are final.
6. Members may enter no more than 10 entries, 1 rabbit per class (Depending on cage space) Changes may be made at the superintendent's discretion when circumstances warrant.
7. Each club is responsible for cleaning their area for herdsmanship. Members are responsible for feeding and watering their own rabbits and cleaning under cages. Each 4-H member is responsible for their own tack.
8. Decorations are to be self-standing, not heavy. Do not attach to cage legs or cage bottoms. Check with the Superintendent before attaching – you must be able to clean under the cages.
9. "For Sale" signs or business cards are not allowed on the cages. A bulletin board is available for this.
