Program News

4-H Year Enrollment and Re-enrollment | | Starts September 15, 2017

Our official 4-H year runs from October 1, 2017-September 30, 2018, so enrollment is now open! If you know which club you want to join—great! If you are thinking about changing clubs, but know for sure you want to join 4-H—you should still register and change clubs later. Follow these simple re-enrollment instructions below.

1. Find a computer, open a web browser and type in or.4Honline.com
2. Select “I have a profile” if you know your email address and password for 4HOnline*
3. Click “Continue to Family”
4. Member List—Please use this page to “add a new family member” for new youth or volunteers that will be associated with your family record. Click Edit next to the family or member’s name to verify or update information. Please keep this information up to date; we use this database to contact you. DO NOT add a new record for a member that is already listed. Parents that are not going to be adult Volunteer Leaders should not be added as an adult family member. (Parent information is entered when setting up the family profile and on member records)
5. When adding new members—Set up Profile information by typing in the boxes or clicking menu items.
6. Click Continue>>
7. Additional Information—Read, Click “Agree” and type the member’s name or guardian’s name in several boxes as you scroll down the page. Volunteers will need to read the corresponding information on our website; Conditions of Volunteer Service and Volunteer Agreement/Code of Ethics
8. Continue>>
9. Add a Club- Highlight/Select a club from the drop down menu. Click “Add Club”. Add more clubs if necessary.
10. Continue>>
11. Add a Project- Highlight/Select a club and project from the 2 drop down menus. If a club project you want to take is not listed for your club, please contact the 4-H office so we can help. If you are a Cloverbud, add **only** the Cloverbud project.
12. Continue>>
13. Add a Group- Only necessary if you are a club officer or Association member, then please select the correct group.
14. Click SUBMIT ENROLLMENT! If you did everything correctly, your enrollment status should say “Pending.”

**If you have forgotten the email address used for 4HOnline please call Jackie at the Extension Office.*

***If you remember your email address but you forgot your password, select “I forgot my password” and enter your email address. 4HOnline will send a temporary password to that email address.*

New members will continue to be able to enroll throughout the year!

Call our office or visit our website for a list of dates where someone is available to help you outside of the normal office hours of 8:30—5:00 pm. A 4-H Staff member or volunteer will have a computer ready to assist you!

Interesting Facts about Enrollment

- The age you are on September 1, 2017, will be what is known as your “4-H age” throughout the 4-H year. You must be 9 years old on September 1 to compete for ribbons at our 4-H Fairs.
- A Junior exhibitor is ages 9-11 years old, Intermediates: 12-14 years, and Seniors: 15-19 years old.
- If a volunteer or youth needs an accommodation to participate in 4-H activities, a request must be made to the 4-H Educator roughly 30 days prior to the event, depending on the complexity of the accommodation. If your child has a disability that could affect participation in all 4-H related activities, please see the 4-H Educator to create an accommodation plan. This needs to be done for every 4-H year.
- If you qualify as a Senior for some state events, you still may be eligible to compete the following year even though you graduated from 4-H.
- Enrollment in 4-H does not guarantee admission to the county fair. Information is being gathered and details will come out in 2018.
- The Code of Conduct is signed by youth and their parents/guardians. We expect the same behavior from the parents as we do from our youth. Anyone who breaks the code of conduct will be counseled by a superintendent or club leader in addition to the 4-H Educator. A policy regarding social media posts will be provided to families in 2018.
- There is a dress code for all who participate or attend 4-H events. Ask your club leader for guidelines.
- All of our past Fourthoughts, Monday Morning Minutes, and pertinent forms can be found on 4HOnline as well as our website.
- Parents do not enroll themselves in 4-H online unless they are interested in being a 4-H volunteer.
- Clubs must have 5 members from 3 different families, and 2 approved adult volunteers to be considered a 4-H club.
- The \$2 per Leader enrollment fee has changed.
- December 31, 2017 is the Deadline to re-enroll all returning volunteers (leaders).

Enrollment fees for 4-H - until January 31st, 2018

- * Fee for ages 9-19: 1 youth=\$30, 2 youth=\$60, 3 youth=\$70, 4 youth=\$80 (if under the same family name/residence)
- * Fee for ages 5-8 (Cloverbuds) is \$2 each. Enroll in Cloverbud project only.
- * Each Club should collect \$2 per volunteer to cover their 4-H insurance.

Please give cash or check payable to OSU to the club treasurer at your next 4-H meeting. A responsible adult will bring all enrollment fees to the Extension Office.

We hope she will continue on in the program as a volunteer. If you have an interest in working with 4-H in a professional capacity, please be watching for the job announcement in the future.

Most members are eligible to receive premium checks, especially those competing with static exhibits. This is a monetary reward for your hard work! The rewards are based on a merit system centered around the placing of the project or contest. You can pick them up at the Extension Center. They will become available October 1.
