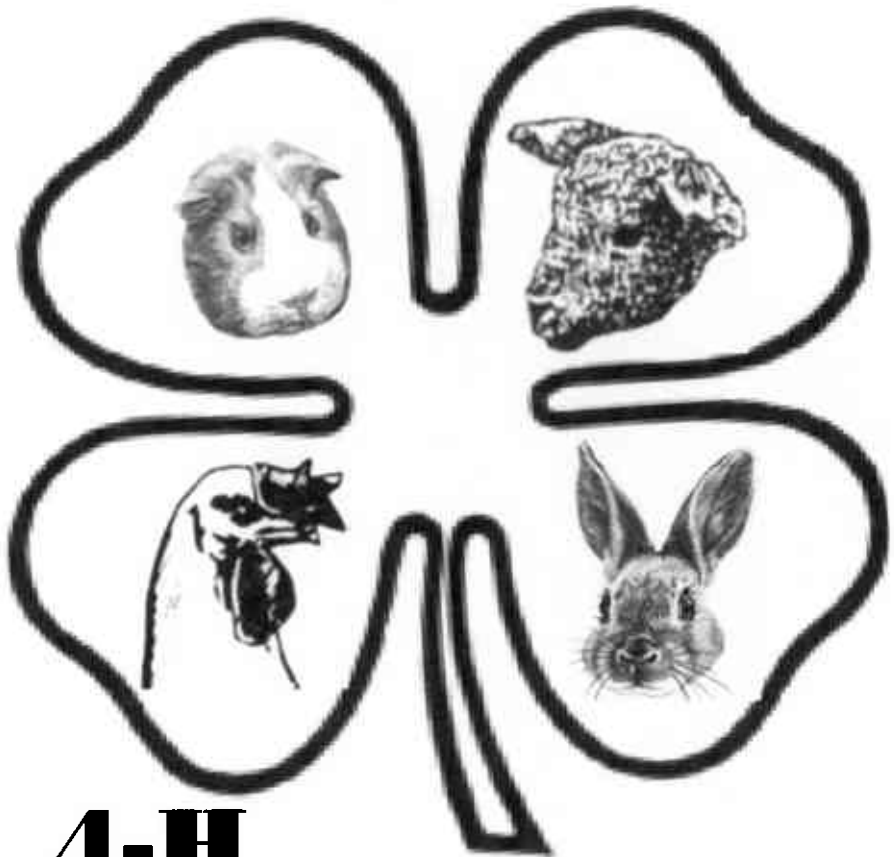

## 4-H GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

### Participation

1. To participate at the Fair, members must be in the 4th grade.
2. Classes for all contestants and exhibitors are based on the 4-H member's grade during the past year. First Year Juniors: Juniors who have not previously shown or entered; Junior: 4th - 6th grades; Intermediates: 7th - 9th grades; Seniors: 10th 12th grades.
3. **Members must have been officially enrolled in all 4-H projects by MARCH 15, 2009, in order to exhibit at the Fair.**

### Exhibit Requirements

1. Project record forms must be completed for the current year up to registration time for each project area entered. **Sheep leaders must submit members' records, entry forms & fees, Code of Conduct form, Code of Ethics form, & the new Country of Origin Labeling form at Fair registration day (5/13), Rabbit members must submit their records before Fair entry day (5/29), Cavy and Poultry members must submit their records on Fair entry day (5/29).**
2. The same animal may not be entered in more than one class (except in Rabbit fur or where another animal is added), and no animal may be entered in both 4-H & FFA.
3. All the entries must be the work of the 4-H member only, & it is the member's responsibility to see that their project is clean & properly cared for.
4. All exhibits must display completed entry tags or stall cards in a legible manner. Ribbons won by the exhibitors must be on display during the time that the Fair is open to the public.
5. The 4-H project manuals shall be the guide for requirements not specified in this Fair booklet.
6. Only properly entered, registered & approved exhibits may be on the grounds.

### Entries

1. Entry fees of \$2 for each entry (including showmanship) **must be paid** at registration time; no exceptions, no refunds. Substitution, within project areas, may be allowed **only** by permission of the project Superintendent. **Pay by cash or check made payable to 4-H/FFA FAIR COMMITTEE.** Any additional fees will be pre-announced and charged at that time.
2. All sheep entries must be pre-registered by **MAY 13**; all rabbit/cavy/poultry entries must be turned into the office by 5/20. No entries will be accepted at Fair that have not met these requirements.
3. Members may make only one entry in a class or sub-class (except where noted) as indicated under project rules, and only one premium will be awarded per entry.
4. A maximum of 20 entries may be made in any one project area. Pens, herds, and group entries are considered as one entry.
5. Exhibitors must be present to show their animals or to participate in a contest. Exceptions may be granted by Superintendent.
6. Animals used in showmanship must be exhibited in conformation class.
7. To warrant set-up and conduct of a contest, at least five members must sign up to participate.
8. Any entry not meeting exhibit requirements as stated in this Fair book and 4-H project manuals will not be accepted.
9. The Fair Management assumes no responsibility for the loss or injury to animals, equipment, exhibits, participants or spectators.

### Delivery and Removal of Exhibits

1. **Members are responsible for transportation of exhibits to and from the Fair (except auction animals) and for the exhibit to be in place at designated times.**
2. All exhibits must remain on display until official Fair release time. Exceptions may be granted with the advance written approval of the Superintendent(s)
3. Those in violation of these rules will forfeit premium points, and may not be allowed to exhibit in the future at the Jackson County Fair.

### Methods of Judging and Awards

1. In all cases, the awarding of ribbons and awards will be at the discretion of the division judge.
2. Premium points will be calculated on the highest ribbon awarded to exhibitor as indicated in each division.
3. Exhibitors will accumulate points from all fair-related events during the year. The value of the premium points is determined by the total number of points awarded and funds available. **Premium checks will only be written to those exhibitors earning MORE than 5 points for the year.** Premium checks will be available for members to pick up at the Extension Office in October.
4. The Modified Danish Method of judging will be used. Entries will be placed in group awards according to individual exhibit quality. Animals will be lined up by the judge in descending order of quality. Ribbons to be awarded are: *Purple Award* - Designates class winners that are selected for Championship Class; *Lavender Award* - Designates reserve to Purple; *Blue Award* - Designates excellent to superior quality exhibit; *Red Awards* - Designates good quality exhibit; *White Award* - Designates acceptable quality exhibit.
6. Champions & Reserve Champions will only be selected where judge deems entries are of championship quality.
7. Special awards, trophies, equipment, etc., to be awarded at the Fair will be announced at a later time.
8. Selection of Special Award winners will be made by the judge when possible and by division Superintendents when not possible.

### Code of Conduct & Dress Code

1. Members are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent to the principles common to the 4-H program.
2. **4-H Livestock Project Exhibitor Dress Code:** Exhibitors will enter market classes, showmanship classes and the auction ring dressed in showmanship attire. No costumes will be allowed on exhibitor or animal. An extension agent, superintendent, assistant superintendent or show ring management may deem clothing inappropriate. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of privilege to show and/or sell now and in the future.
3. In all areas members should dress appropriately for the occasion, be courteous, clean and display good manners. Language must be appropriate/respectful of others. No swearing.
4. Participants will not use tobacco, alcohol, drugs (except those directed by doctor), fireworks or firearms are prohibited except by those sanctioned by the Fair. Exhibitors will not be allowed in the immediate area when they are being used.
5. Shoplifting or theft of public or personal property will NOT be tolerated. Avoid roughness and damage to the facilities.
6. 4-H events are to encourage interaction among all members of the group, but not exclusively with another person. Kissing & other sexual displays of personal affection distract from the group & are not appropriate behavior.
7. Members not abiding by the Code

of Conduct rules will: a) have an opportunity to explain actions to staff in charge, and b) forfeit their rights to exhibit and/or all premium points. Parents/guardians will be contacted. Decisions on misconduct will be made by the Jackson County Fair Policy

Committee.

8. Entry forms now have the State Code of Conduct written on the back, and signatures and dates are required of members and parent/guardian on the front of the form by Registration day.

## Ownership, Health & Livestock Rules

1. Sheep must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor by the 3rd Saturday in April of the current year (4/18/2009). Possession date for mature small animals is April 15 of the current year.

### Health Requirements

1. All animals are subject to examination by a veterinarian.
2. Any animal showing signs of infectious diseases or unsightly conditions, as determined by a fair/4-H/FFA designated licensed veterinarian, will not be allowed on the grounds.
3. To enter Oregon all mammals and most birds must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI, "health certificate") issued less than 30 days prior to entry and an import permit issued by the Oregon Department of Agriculture. Some pets are exempt from the permit requirement. Tests and vaccinations are required for cattle, horses, swine, sheep, goats, and poultry. Due to ever-changing requirements on various species and disease outbreaks, owners and prospective owners MUST check with a veterinarian for the latest information on the species of their animal prior to transport to Oregon. If testing is required, the CVI must include official ID of each animal tested, lab name & location, date sample was taken, accession number, and test results. "Pending" results are not acceptable.

### Auction Sales

1. A member may sell a maximum of three lots in the 4-H/FFA auctions in one year, but not more than one large animal (beef, sheep, swine) or one specialty animal (rabbits, poultry) per Fair.
2. All members must turn in a completed copy of a Country of Origin Labeling (COOL) Affidavit/Declaration for each market animal (rabbits are exempt) they plan to sell at auction.

### Auction Sales continued

3. Auction animals must have been owned, entered, shown and taken through the sale ring by the member.
4. Only animals that are finished and ready for market will be accepted for sale. The judges' decision is final.
5. Market animal exhibitors are responsible for weighing their animals at the times specified in the schedule. Only one animal/pen can be taken across the scales except where noted.
6. There shall be no re-weighing. Weighmaster's decision is final.
7. Animals may not be withdrawn from the sale. All animals listed in sale catalog will sell.
8. Late lots will sell at buyback price and not go through the ring.
9. The Auction Committee will not transport private treaty animals; please do not ask.
10. A 6½% deduction from the sale of the animal(s) will be withheld and placed in the Jackson County 4-H/FFA Auction Committee Indemnity Fund for reimbursement of condemned animals or losses and promotion of auctions & programs as determined by the committee.
11. There shall be no by-bidding.
12. All sale animals shall be barred from entry in other market shows.
13. All market animals carrying an Auction Sale tag must be accompanied by a livestock release form, signed by the Release Superintendent, before they can be removed from the Fairgrounds. NO EXCEPTIONS.
14. There will be only one Champion and one Reserve Champion of the Show in Market Sheep. Grand Champions will be declared by the appropriate judges between 4-H and FFA animals.
15. Animals to be sold in the auction will be cared for by the member until claimed by the owner after the sale or until delivered to slaughter.
16. The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the Junior Livestock Show as follows: a) Animals must be in good health and the carcass free of drug or chemical residue. b) Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required with-

drawal periods. c) Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed. If drug or other chemical residues are found in the tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned. If drug or other chemical residues are found in the tissue of carcasses of animal sold through any sale connected with the Jackson County Fair Junior Livestock Show, said show will in no way be liable or responsible for condition of carcass or sale price of animal. Exhibitor forfeits all rights to the sale price and shall refund it to the buyer. Before administering antibiotics and/or sulfonamides, consult a licensed practicing veterinarian, or label directions of the drug. (Leader/superintendent must be notified within 2 weeks of sale.)

17. All 4-H/FFA members and parents must sign a "Code of Ethics Form For Market Animals" and submit it before the animal will be admitted to Fair. (Sheep members must turn in these forms on Registration Day (5/14). Forms are available at the Extension Office and county website.
18. Members must turn in a hand written thank you letter, in an addressed, stamped and UNSEALED envelope prior to receiving their auction check. Check will be withheld until member adheres to rule. Dates and times of auction check distribution will be announced.

### Sheep Auction Rules:

1. Market lambs must weigh between 100 and 150 lbs. and shall not have over 1/8" of pulled fleece when they go through the vet check and cross the scales.
2. All sheep must have been ear tagged and weighed on the third Saturday in April of the current year.
3. All market lambs must have gained a minimum of 1/3 pound per day from weigh-in day until weigh-in at fair.
4. All of the above criteria must be met to be eligible to sell.
5. Appropriate attire for members is ex-

pected. See **Livestock Dress Code Rules** on page 6, item 2 under Code of Conduct.

- Members are not to approach buyers in regards to buying their lambs back. Once the sales receipts are completed, no changes will be allowed. Members not abiding this rule will have an opportunity to explain their actions to a committee, may forfeit their premium points, and not be allowed to show in future Jackson County Fairs.

## Herdsmanship

- All livestock projects will be judged.
- 4-H Herdsmanship contests help teach members to be courteous, orderly and take proper care of their animals.
- Clubs must have at least five members exhibiting in the same exhibit area at the Fair to be eligible to compete in the contest. (Exceptions may be granted by consensus of clubs in specific exhibit area.)
- Scoring will be done by members within like project areas or by adults as determined by the show management.
- The following score card will be used: Members (appearance, cooperation, courtesy & conduct, member's work) -

## Showmanship

- All animal exhibitors must participate in showmanship contests relating to their exhibits. Animals exhibited in showmanship class **MUST** be shown in a conformation class.
- Contestants must show their own animals which have been exhibited at Fair.
- Contestants must do their own fitting, training, clipping and blocking.
- Judges may ask questions of the contestant regarding any of their project work and/or to demonstrate their abilities.
- Abusive language or abuse of an animal in any contest can be reasons for dismissal from the show ring at the discretion of the show Superintendent.
- Classes will be subdivided by member classification, not by breed of animal shown.

## Specialty Animal/Rabbit

- In order to sell a Grand Champion animal/pen, there must be five combined 4-H exhibits in each of the following categories: Rabbit Broilers and Rabbit Fryers. There must be at least ten combined 4-H exhibits in the categories listed for two to sell.
- 4-H & FFA exhibitors will show against each other only to determine sale order.
- Specialty Animals will be reviewed by the Auction Committee annually.

25 pts, Animals (clean, care, secured) - 50 pts, Barns (alleys, pens, feed and equipment, stall cards) - 25 pts.

- Blue, Red, White and "unacceptable" awards will be made daily at the exhibitors' meeting with the daily score compiled to determine the winner.
- Any club receiving an "unacceptable" award ribbon for herdsmanship may be removed and premiums withheld for exhibitors in that division, at the discretion of the committee.
- Rosette Ribbons and a \$35 cash premium (from Fairboard) will be awarded in the following divisions: Rabbits/Cavies/Poultry and Sheep.

- The purpose of 4-H Livestock Showmanship is to teach courtesy, good grooming, poise, and confidence and how to fit, train and handle animals.
- Basis for scoring: Club member (clean, neat, courteous, attentive, confident) - 25; The animal (clean, good condition for breeding or market, feet trimmed, properly groomed) - 25; Showing the Animal (ability to show the animal to its best advantage and to move the animal as directed by the judge) - 50 points.
- Champion Showman and Reserve Champion Showman in each age division are expected to compete in Grand Champion Showmanship contests where available.

- Grand Champion Showman from Sheep is invited to participate in the

Round Robin Showmanship during the Jackson County Fair.

## Oregon State Fair

- All entries made in the 4-H Division at the Oregon State Fair must be approved by Jackson County Extension 4-H Agent.
- All exhibits entered in State Fair must meet the requirements outlined in the Oregon State Fair 4-H Exhibitor Book,

- available on the 4-H State website.
- Livestock members earning blue or above may enter State Fair classes but should make their interest known at the 4-H Fair Office or Extension Office by Aug. 7.



## SHEEP DIVISION

**Superintendents: Bobble Dulany,  
Kim Skomerza, Kris Vincent**

- Only 4-H Sheep entries registered for Fair are to be housed in the 4-H Sheep barn.
- Clubs can start removing decorations and hand-carry out items after the last lot has exited the barn for the auction line-up. An announcement will be made in the barn. No vehicles or trailers can be brought to the barn or loaded until after the last lot has sold. Any violations will be handled by the Superintendents.
- General rules and livestock rules governing 4-H exhibits also apply.
- Animals must be owned and cared for by the exhibitor since the third Saturday of April of the current year (2009: 4/18).
- Registered and grade sheep will show together. In order to receive an association award, the exhibitor of the winning ewe will have to show proof of registration in the appropriate association (including flock tag and ear tag where required by the association).

- A member may use any of his/her project sheep shown at the Fair for showmanship. This animal must have been shown in a conformation class.
- Any sheep fit by an adult will be pulled from the Fair and premium points forfeited.
- Members may exhibit no more than two breeding animals per class, registered and/or grade.
- No inhumane treatment of animals will be tolerated.
- Dress Code: See **Livestock Dress Code Rules** on page 6, item 2 under Code of Conduct.
- Absolutely no soliciting or raffle selling in the Sheep barn.
- No paint or artificial coloring allowed on hair or wool.
- No drenching.
- All lambs must have scrapie tags.

**7712\_\_030 Member's Breeding Flock**, (ewe lamb, yearling ewe, and producing ewe), owned by one exhibitor. Score Card: breed characteristics - 40; uniformity of flock - 25; improvement in quality - 25; presentation of flock - 10.

### MARKET LAMBS

1. All general & auction rules apply.
2. All lambs must have been ear tagged and weighed on the third Saturday in April (4/18/09) to be eligible to sell. All lambs must have scrapie tags.
3. The auction lambs must have shown in the Jackson County Spring Fair. White ribbon lambs, commercially unacceptable, will not sell. Lambs must be marketable quality, weighing a minimum of 100 pounds and a maximum of 150 pounds. All lambs must have a minimum gain of 1/3 pound per day from third Saturday in April to fair weigh-in.
4. All market lambs will be weighed from 1 pm until 6 pm opening day.
5. Male market lambs must be wethered (castrated) properly. Judge's decision will be final.
6. Based on the entire entry of market lambs, approximately the first 100 lambs will sell individually. The rest will sell in pen-lots. In determining order, purples will be first. Blue ribbon lambs in each class will follow in descending order.
7. Only one lamb may be exhibited by a member in the market lamb class. Must be shown by the member.
8. Market lambs may not have more than 1/8-inch of pulled wool fleece and must be dry and clean at weigh-in. If not proper length, the market lambs will not be weighed until proper length is acquired.
9. Market ewe lambs must show in market classes only, except when also used as produce in Class 7712\_\_020.
10. Lambs will be shown in weight classes, starting with lightweight (100-120) lambs continuing through middleweight (121-135) to heavyweight (136-150).
11. In Champion market lamb class, the judge will dismiss purple ribbon lambs in order to designate sale order.

12. If an exhibitor misses their turn in the auction sale line-up he/she will not be allowed to sell their animal in the sale. The animal will be sold at buy-back price.
13. Methods of Judging:
  - a) Purple awards - designate class winners who will be eligible to compete in championship classes. Lambs grading USDA prime or choice in quality grade and having superior conformation and cut ability. Yield grade 2.5 or less;
  - b) Lavender award - Reserve to Purple;
  - c) Blue award - Lambs grading USDA prime or choice in quality grade and having above average or average conformation and cut ability. Yield grade 2.5 to 3.5;
  - d) Red award - Lambs grading USDA prime or choice in quality below average conformation;
  - e) White award - Commercially unacceptable (for market).
14. Members must show in showmanship in order to sell at auction.

### MARKET CLASSES

**771300000 Market Lamb** (no yearling teeth)

**771300020 Specialty Market Lamb Class** (no yearling teeth). Lambs not eligible for the auction. Members may only have one entry and will compete for ribbons and premiums only.

**Feeder Lamb**, to be determined at weigh-in only. (This is a premium class only for market lambs not meeting the required sale weight. Exhibitors of underweight Market Ewe Lambs may enter the animal in the Ewe Lamb class).

### SHOWMANSHIP

1. All general showmanship rules apply.
  2. Classes will be grouped at the discretion of the show management. No consideration will be given to the breed, age or sex of the member's animals.

### 4-H CLUB PENS

Pens will be judged by the following criteria: uniformity of animal quality - 50; neatness of showman - 25; presentation - 25 pts.  
Pen of Five Market Lambs: Class will

consist of five market lambs, any breed belonging to five different members of the same 4-H club. A club may show two pens. Rosette award.

### SHEEP WOOL and LLAMA/ALPACA FIBER CLASSES

These classes are held at the County Fair. Fleece and Fiber entries need to be registered by June 30, Noon - 7 pm, in the Extension Auditorium. **Entries must be delivered by 10 am SUNDAY, JULY 19, to Padgham Pavilion** for judging. Exhibitors are invited to remain on hand to hear judge's critique. Exhibits will remain on display through fair week. See county fair exhibitor book for additional information.



## RABBIT DIVISION

### Superintendents:

1. General rules governing 4-H exhibits apply. All mature rabbits must have been owned and cared for by the exhibitor as of April 15th.
2. 4-H members must be present to show their rabbits in showmanship. They have to be present to sell their rabbits at the auction and also must be present when selling their rabbit for the barbecue.
3. Rabbits may be marked down for any of the following defects: crooked feet, legs, or spine and potbelly.
4. Rabbits must be checked from 3-8 pm on Friday for disease, ear mites, vent disease, infected sores or any other contagious disease or they will not be allowed to show at the Fair. Infected rabbits will not be penned and must leave the grounds.
5. Conformation rabbits may be placed down but not disqualified on weight.
6. ALL RABBITS MUST BE PERMANENTLY AND LEGIBLY TATOED before 8 pm Friday night of fair.
7. Does nursing litters under six weeks of age will not be allowed.
8. If there are not enough animals to make up a class in a particular breed, it will be done under "Other Breeds."
9. All entries must be pre-registered as mentioned in General Rules. A COMPLETED RABBIT ANIMAL SCIENCE RECORD IS REQUIRED & IS DUE BEFORE FAIR ENTRY DAY.
10. **NOTE:** For entry registration, you must use the following definitions for rabbit variety categories: **Broken** includes any recognized breed color in conjunction with white and carrying the breed pattern. The body color is evenly distributed in a patched, spotted or blanket pattern. **Solid** covers all rabbit varieties that are NOT broken, and include established "patterns" such as Himalayan, Sable Point, Siamese Sable, Agouti and Ticked.
11. Rabbits will be judged in accordance with ARBA "Standard of Perfection" Guide.
12. No breeding of rabbits at Fair.
13. **Death, Disease or Injury Rule:** If a rabbit dies, is diseased or injured after possession deadline of April 15, the Superintendent must be notified immediately. At the discretion of the Superintendent, a rabbit can be borrowed or bought for showmanship only, but the 4-H mem-

ber will not be eligible to participate in the championship showmanship class.

14. Members may enter one rabbit fur class per breed, with no limits (except the 20 max. per project area rule). The specific rabbit for a fur class does NOT have to be picked until check-in time at fair (therefore, on the Registration Forms, the ear tag number space for that class may be left blank). Any entries without an ear tag number by 8 pm Friday night of Fair will be disqualified. Each entry in the fur class needs to have received a blue ribbon placing in its conformation class, or it will be disqualified from the fur class.
15. Only one rabbit per breed, variety, sex and age category can be exhibited per member, and can-

not be entered in more than one class, except fur class.

16. **Dress Code:** Members must wear showmanship clothes in show ring, and in the auction ring during Parade of Champions or to sell. Showmanship clothes include long-sleeve shirts, long pants and closed-toe shoes; they do NOT include shorts, tank tops, halter tops, hats, thongs or open-toed shoes. Members not abiding by these rules will forfeit their right to exhibit. Decisions on dress code are made by the Rabbit committee.

## MARKET RABBITS

- Judging will be based on conformation, condition and uniformity of the pen. A pen consists of 3 rabbits WHICH DO NOT HAVE TO BE LITTER MATES. Entries may be white or colored pelt, with separate market classes for purebreds and crossbreeds with overall champion and reserve champion selected.
- 4-H members entering a market pen must own the doe or does producing the market pen. The pen must be owned, raised and in the possession of the 4-H member and be part of their project.
- Rabbits will be weighed during check-in; those not meeting weight limits will be disqualified.
- All market pens must be brought to the table in cages. In the auction ring, members may have assistance from another 4-H member only.
- If there are 5 4-H and FFA Roaster Pens, who qualify by weight, the Grand Champion will sell. If there are 10 4-H and FFA Roasters, who qualify by weight, the Grand Champion and Reserve Champion will sell. The same applies for Fryers. If there are not at least 5 pens in either Roasters or Fryers classes the pens will be combined to form a Market Rabbit Class. 4-H and FFA Champions will compete against each other to determine sale order.
- Clubs wanting to sell rabbits to the fair/auction committee for the barbecue dinner MUST provide member or relative to assist with the butchering and processing.
- A jackpot will be held for market pens and money will be paid according to judge's ranking. Pens must have earned a blue ribbon in the market classes to be eligible to participate in the jackpot, but cannot be Champions that will sell at Auction, nor are they eligible to sell to the fair/auction committee for the barbecue dinner. Jackpot participants, however, can donate their pen(s) to be butchered for the dinner.
