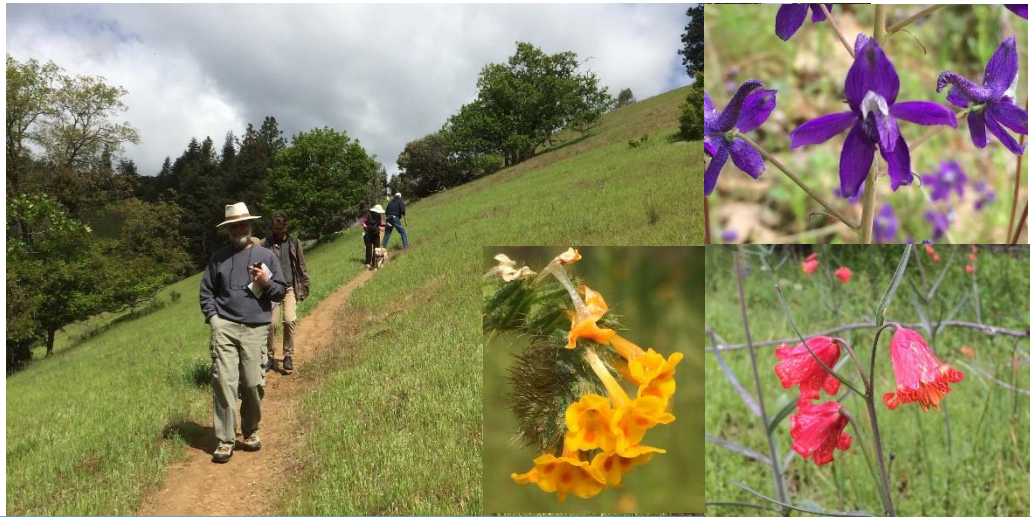

During spring, the trail is the perfect time for wildflower viewing!

From February to May, the Sterling Mine Ditch Trail is an excellent place for wildflower viewing. We will walk through and near oak woodland, mixed conifer forest, grasslands, buck brush chaparral and a profusion of spring Siskiyou wildflowers, such as shooting stars and fawn lilies.

Bring a camera and writing materials so you can make a record of the new plant acquaintances you may make. The first quarter mile is relatively steep, but just a 200 ft. elevation gain. Be sure you are fit to complete a 4 mile hike in rolling terrain.

Class is limited to 15 participants. Register early!
