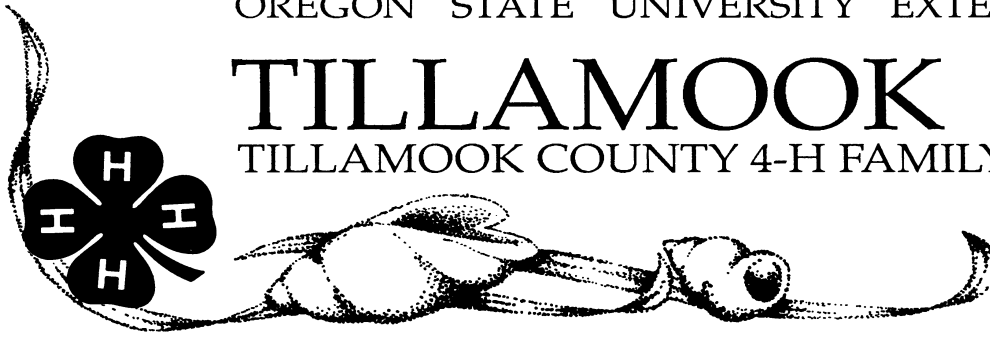

County Fair Entries



All 4-H fair pre-entry materials are due **Friday, July 16**, by 5:00 p.m. Early entries are encouraged. The following items are due:

- Fair entry forms
- Records books
- Kitchen meals orders and payments
- Dorm registrations and payments
- Revolving trophies
- Award applications/nominations
- Stall request forms

• **Policy for Late Entries:** Late fair entry forms will be accepted with a valid reason on the policy waiver form, but members may not be eligible for champion/reserve champion ribbons and special awards/trophies.



Pre-cut Mats Available for Photos

Do you need a mat board and foam core board for mounting your 4-H photo exhibits for the fair? The OSU Extension Service has an assortment of pre-cut mats in various mat colors and sizes available for purchase at \$5 per mat (which includes the foam core backing). Stop by and check out what we have available. Make checks payable to the OSU Extension Service.



County Fair Classes Open to All 4-H Members

This year there are several new and revised classes open to all 4-H members. Please make sure to enter those classes on your 4-H fair entry form which is due **Friday, July 16**. These classes will be eligible for ribbons and premiums. Check the premium book for complete information and state fair eligibility.

Educational Displays – 4-H members may exhibit educational displays in any area. Members do not have to be enrolled in a project to exhibit a display.



Creative Crafts – All 4-H members are eligible to exhibit any kind of craft.

4-H Expressive Arts – All 4-H members are eligible to enter artwork (original and non-original), photography, ceramics, leathercraft and fiber art exhibits. Within art there are classes for drawing, painting, printmaking/stenciling, collage/mosaic, dyeing/marbling, 2 and 3 dimensional projects, wearable clothing/accessories & functional art. Please check the new exhibit mounting requirements.



4-H Horticulture – All 4-H members are eligible to enter exhibits in container gardening, cut flowers and vegetables. Check out the new publications on how to exhibit herbs, cut flowers and vegetables.



4-H Journals – This is a place for any 4-H member to exhibit a journal that relates to their 4-H experience in a 4-H day camp, after-school program or 4-H project.

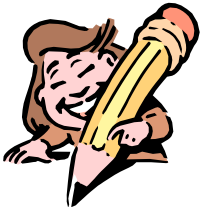
4-H Creative Writing – Anyone in 4-H may enter. There are classes for poetry, essays & short stories.

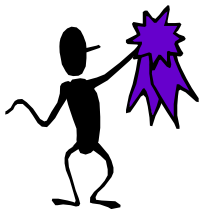

County Fair Volunteers Needed



What Does It Mean When I Receive a Ribbon For My Project?



Computer/Lego/GIS/GPS/Rocketry – Any 4-H member can enter a 4-H exhibit in software applications (word processing, spreadsheets, PowerPoint, graphics, data-base management); programming; hardware design; and GPS/GIS (projects/ maps).

Lego Building & Robotics Challenges—Try your hand at programming a robot for the robot race, SumoBot contest or bring your own programmed robot and show what it can do. Basic robots will be provided for the robot race and Sumo Bot contest and contestants will be put into teams for the programming and final building. Individuals can also build and bring their own lego trebuchet/catapult for a marsh-mellow shooting contest or participate in one of the theme Lego building contests. Remember to pre-enter by **July 16**. Check the premium book for schedule & rules.

4-H Chess Tournament – This tournament is open to all 4-H members (grades K-12) who would like to participate. The tournament will be held on **Thursday, August 12**, 10:30 am in the 4-H exhibit area. If you would like to participate, please include the chess tournament on your 4-H entry form.

Ready-to-Wear Fashion Revue—Have you wanted to participate in fashion revue, but you are not a seamstress. Try the new ready-to-wear fashion revue that is open to all 4-H members. Check the premium book for complete rules and make sure you sign up on your fair entry for by **July 16**.



Volunteers are needed to help out at the Tillamook County Fair, **August 4 through August 14**. Parents, teen members or leaders may volunteer by calling the OSU Extension office. Listed below are some of the volunteer positions:

Clerks are needed to work with judges in all projects. Clerking is a great way to learn what judges look for and how they make decisions. Training for clerks will be on Monday, **August 2**, 7 p.m. at the OSU Extension office. Clerks attending the training will receive a fair gate ticket for the day(s) they are clerking. 4-H uses the merit judging method for all exhibits, contests and divisions. In most 4-H competitive events, you are being judged against the standard. Just because you receive a red or white ribbon does not mean you should not feel good about yourself or your project. These ribbons mean some improvement is needed according to the judge’s opinion on that day.

Ribbon award definitions:

- Blue:** Excellent to superior, meets or very nearly meets the top standard
- Red:** Good to excellent, but needs some improvement to meet the standard
- White:** Good but more improvements are needed to meet the standard



County Fair Reminders

General

- ☑ Parking passes are not provided for 4-H leaders or members. Call the Fair office 842-2272 to get your name on a waiting list to buy barn parking passes. After open-class dairy exhibitors receive their barn parking passes, the rest will be sold on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- ☑ The 4-H fair office will be open 8 a.m. – 8 p.m., Monday – Saturday of fair. The exhibit building does not officially open until 10 a.m. If you need to access the 4-H fair office before the fair officially opens, please call ahead so that someone can meet you and open the appropriate doors.
- ☑ Earliest start times will be followed. No shows will start earlier than the scheduled time. This allows families to plan their time at fair. Meal times will be observed, please allow 45 minutes for members eating in the dorm.

Static Exhibits

- ☑ The judging schedule for all static exhibits will be as follows. Please remind members to sign-in for interview judging with the judge or clerk when they arrive. The schedule will not be mailed out prior to fair as in previous years:

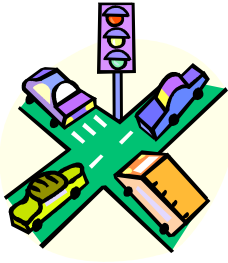


- ☑ Exhibit tags are required on all static exhibits. There are special exhibit tags for flower exhibits. Most projects also require a special 5 x 8 inch card that answers specific questions about the project. Check the 4-H fair supply table at the OSU Extension office for these tags and cards.
- ☑ 4-H static exhibits including educational displays, home economics, natural resources, expressive arts, engineering, and horticulture, will be released from 9:00 to 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, **August 14**. No early exhibit pick up will be allowed. Those exhibits not picked up on Saturday evening may be picked up at the fairgrounds on Sunday, **August 15**, 8:00 am–5:00 pm. We will not bring exhibits back to the Extension office. It is the member’s responsibility to make arrangements for exhibits to be picked up at the fairgrounds. There is no security for exhibits after Saturday evening of fair. *Continued on next page...*

- ☑ All exhibits selected for state fair must be taken home by the 4-H member, re-tagged and brought back to the OSU Extension office by Tuesday, **August 17**, 5:00 p.m. Exceptions are foods, which are due Mon., **Aug. 23** by 10:00 a.m. and horticulture, which are due Tues., **Aug. 24** by 1:00 p.m.

Animal Science



- ☑ If a member has conflicting shows, please notify the superintendent of both shows. Since showmanship is required, it is the highest priority. Other 4-H members may show conformation animals for the member with a conflict. If showmanship for 2 shows conflict, one show may be delayed for the member.
- ☑ Traffic patterns for loading and unloading animals – enter through the west gate by horse barn and exit at the north gate by the dorm. Try not to block traffic while loading and please move your vehicle as soon as possible.
- ☑ 4-H animals and records will be released beginning at 8 p.m. Saturday night.



Positive Youth Development & Sportsmanship

One of the purposes of the 4-H program is to provide opportunities for positive youth development for our members. Our goal is to produce “Blue Ribbon” kids, not simply to win blue ribbons.

Please review the article on sportsmanship from the May/June issue of the Tides and talk to 4-H club members and their parents about what to expect at fair. It is very important to remember that along with success there may also be times when things don't go as hoped for and 4-H members may be disappointed in the results of their efforts. Helping youth to learn to be gracious winners and also how to deal with disappointment are important life skills that they can learn through participation at the fair.



4-H Activities Code of Conduct

As summer continues 4-H members will be out in front of the public. 4-H members and leaders are expected to abide by the "4-H Activities Code of Conduct" at all county and state events, including fair. 4-H leaders & parents should model appropriate behavior for their members.

Patterns will be posted the first day of 4-H Horse Fair at the South Arena.

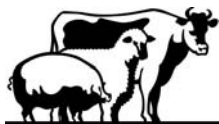


MANDATORY Rabbit/Poultry Weigh In

There will be a hands-on livestock judging clinic held during the Junior Livestock Auction Committee courtesy weigh-in, on Tuesday, **July 14**, 6:00-7:30 p.m. at the Tillamook Co. Fairgrounds Livestock Barn. 4-H/FFA members are encouraged to bring their animals to be weighed so that they can determine how to manage them for the final days before fair and to participate in the clinic.



Small Animal Prefair

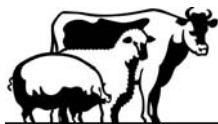

Livestock Judging Contest



The Tillamook County 4-H Livestock Judging Contest will be held at the Clatsop County Fair in Astoria on Tuesday, **August 3rd** at 9:00 a.m. Make your entry on the back of the fair entry form by Friday, July 16th. Contact the Extension Office if you need a ride. The carpool will leave the OSU Extension Service at 7:00 a.m.



Small Animal Check-In at Fair



Small Animals (rabbits, cavies, poultry & pigeons) must be checked in from 4 – 7 p .m. on Tuesday of fair. All small animals will be vet-checked and clerk sheets will be verified at check-in. Small animals may not be put in cages until the vet check is complete



Egg Judging at Fair



Eggs will be judged after the poultry show on Thursday of fair. Eggs should be delivered to the poultry show on Thursday or eggs arriving earlier should be taken to the 4-H office upstairs in the main exhibit building to be refrigerated.



Poultry Testing at Fair



Each year, chickens being exhibited are given a blood test to check for presence or history of a bacteria, Salmonella pullorum. Our county fair poultry have always tested negative for this type of bacteria, but we still need to check them to make sure. If you see your birds being tested, don't worry, this routine test doesn't hurt the animals and only takes a minute or two.

Testing is mandatory and administered through the USDA Animal Health and Plant Inspection Service (APHIS). A veterinarian will test the animals during county fair. The test is an anti-body-antigen reaction and involves taking a small sample of blood by pricking the vein under the arm of each animal and mixing this with a reagent on a plate to read the results.



Do Your Animals Meet the Public? What you Should Know



Many of our 4-H clubs take their animals to public events and places. This can be an excellent educational time for the public, as well as positive promotion for 4-H. In recent years, more attention has been focused on diseases or bacteria that can be carried by animals. Some events now have rules about petting animals and providing hand washing. Here are some tips for making an animal petting experience safe for the public.

- Supervise anyone petting your animals. Make sure you remind them to wash their hands. Find out where hand washing stations or bathrooms are located, and ask people to use them.
- Post a sign reminding people that animals can carry disease and that they should wash their hands.
- Consider providing your own hand washing station. Hand sanitizer only works on clean hands. If someone has dirt or food on their hands, they need to wash them in soap and water.
- Keep food and items like pacifiers away from the animal petting area.
- Be prepared to answer questions from the public about diseases that animals can carry.



E-coli Precautions



Recently two people in rural Oregon died from e-coli infections. A three year old son of a 4-H leader and an elderly grandfather. It is critical that 4-H members and others wash their hands after contact with animals. Farm folks have sometimes joked about how it is people who have not eaten the “peck of dirt” required to be healthy that get sick from e-coli and other pathogens. This is not true. Anyone can get sick. Special precautions should be taken around vulnerable populations including young children, the elderly and anyone who is already sick. 4-H leaders need to reinforce the importance of hand washing after handling animals at meetings, at home, when visiting others, and at the fair.



State Fair

State Fair Volunteers Needed

Clerks are needed in the exhibit building at state fair on Tuesday, **August 24**. They help keep score sheets with exhibits, attach ribbons to exhibits, and help with general organization. No experience is necessary.

Summer Canning Classes Scheduled

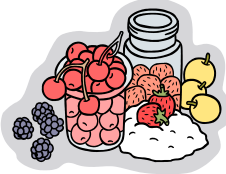
