It is time for all 4-H'ers to start working on their entry forms for the Fair. **Please read this letter and the county fair premium book for instructions (available in the June 1 issue of the Headlight Herald, from the OSU Extension Service, or on the web at <http://extension.oregonstate.edu/tillamook>).**

2011 Tillamook County 4-H Fair Timeline

Please note:

- *Not all judged 4-H activities occur during the week of fair (see schedule below)*
- *4-H entry forms for listing the exhibits the member is planning to bring to the fair are enclosed with this letter. Complete the 4-H fair entry form and turn it in at the OSU Extension Service office by July 13.*
- *Actual 4-H exhibits need to be brought to the fairgrounds according to the schedule below. Some exhibits are brought on August 3-4, others on August 8 or 9.*
- *The term "interview-judging" means that the judge will look at the exhibit along with the 4-H member and ask questions and make suggestions; please allow time for that when you bring your exhibits. Interview judging is optional, but is part of the learning process for the 4-H member.*

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Fair Entry Form Due:** 4-H members planning to exhibit at fair must turn in a completed Fair Entry Form listing the exhibits they plan to bring to fair by **Wednesday, July 13.**
- Member Conduct:** 4-H members participating in fair are expected to abide by the “4-H Activities Code of Conduct.”
- Parent & Leader Responsibility** 4-H members are ultimately the responsibility of their parent/guardian throughout fair. The role of the 4-H leader is to provide advice and guidance to the 4-H member about their 4-H project(s), to help supervise 4-H areas at the fairgrounds and to help supervise members while participating in 4-H events.
- Member Fair Passes:** Free fair admission wristbands for 4-H members that are EXHIBITING in 4-H at the Tillamook County Fair should be picked up on Monday or Tuesday of fair week between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. at the 4-H office on the second floor of the main exhibit building at the fairgrounds. Fashion Revue participants can pick up their wristbands during fashion revue judging. 4-H members without wristbands will be charged admission after the fair begins on Wednesday.
- Leader Fair Passes:** Club leaders who have enrolled by June 1 will receive day admission tickets for the days they have members participating at fair. Tickets should be picked up on Monday and Tuesday of fair week at the 4-H office on the fairgrounds.
- Fair Clean-Up** All 4-H and FFA members are expected to help with fair clean-up and set-up. Barn/pen assignments may be based upon participation. If your club can't attend any of these clean-up/set-up dates, contact Joy Jones for an alternate activity. Younger 4-H members should be accompanied by an adult during clean-up. Please bring cleaning tools (rakes, brooms, shovels, wheelbarrows, etc.). Mark your calendars and plan to attend.

- Delivering Static Exhibits And Interview Judging:** All static exhibits should be brought to the 4-H exhibit area on the second floor of the main exhibit building at the fairgrounds. Static exhibits will be judged on the following days/times:
- Clothing, fiber arts, home environment, knitting, crocheting or child development exhibits will be interview judged during the fashion revue judging, Wednesday, August 4, 9:00 am-noon or 1-4 pm; Thursday, August 5, 9 am – noon or 1-3 pm; or on Monday, August 8, 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm.
 - All other home economics, expressive arts, natural resources and engineering exhibits will be interview judged on Monday of fair week, 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm on a first-come, first-serve basis.
 - Educational displays will be interview judged on Monday of fair week, 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm or Tuesday of fair week, 9:30 am-11 am.
 - Horticulture exhibits will be judged on Tuesday of fair week, 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm.

Exhibit Tags: An exhibit tag must be securely attached to all exhibits. See the handout “4-H Fair Exhibit Labeling”, which is available at the OSU Extension Service, for more information. Projects in expressive arts, home economics, engineering, natural resources, horticulture and all educational displays require an additional explanation card (5” x 8”) that answers specific questions.

Exhibits Open To All 4-H Members: All 4-H members, regardless of 4-H projects, may enter the following classes:

- general classes (educational display, creative craft, journals, creative writing, chess);
- horticulture classes (container gardening, flowers, vegetables & fruits, and herbs);
- expressive arts classes (original art, non-original art, photography, leathercraft, cast ceramics, fiber arts and cake decorating);
- natural science classes (entomology, geology, forestry, aquatic & sport fishing);
- science, engineering & technology classes (computer software applications & programming, Lego construction, Lego robotics & programming; GPS/GIS, geography, aerospace/aeronautics, & rocketry)

All these exhibits must be listed on the 4-H member’s fair entry form due Wednesday, July 13. These exhibits must be brought to the 4-H exhibit area at fair on Monday of fair week between 9:30 a.m.-noon or 1-3 p.m. and will be interview judged on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Cloverbud Exhibits: (Kindergarten – 3rd grade) There are exhibit classes for Cloverbud members in all projects (except animal science), including home economics, expressive arts, engineering, natural resources, horticulture and science, engineering & technology. Cloverbud exhibits should be brought to the 4-H exhibit area on the second floor of the main exhibit building at the fairgrounds for interview judging on Monday of fair week 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm.

Horticulture Members may enter more than one cut flower, vegetable, or fruit exhibit as long as they are a different kind/type. Please use the cut flower or plate vegetable number as many times as needed based on the number of exhibits you plan to bring; for example, if you think that you will show a rose, a dahlia and an aster – use the cut flower class number three times. (Be realistic about the number of exhibits you think that you will actually enter). Refer to the 4-H Horticulture section of the premium book for a complete list. See the premium book for the quantity for each vegetable or flower exhibit. These publications are available:

Horticulture exhibits should be brought to the 4-H exhibit area on the second floor of the main exhibit building at the fairgrounds on Tuesday of fair week, 9:30 am-noon or 1-3 pm.

- Awards:** Record book scores will be used to break ties when awarding medallions, trophies and special awards. This applies to 4-H exhibits, shows and contests. Members who enter exhibits after the July 13 entry deadline must complete a policy waiver form. Exhibits entered after July 13th may not be eligible for champion/reserve champion ribbons and special awards/trophies.
- Judging Contests:** Judging contests are offered in various project areas. Members are encouraged to participate and may sign up at the contest.
- Record Books:** Record books are due to the OSU Extension Service office by Wednesday, July 13th. Record books will be evaluated by a judge and then put on exhibit during fair week upstairs in the main exhibit hall. Don't forget to pick up your record book when exhibits are released!
- County medals are given to outstanding records submitted by 7th – 12th grade members. Certificates of Achievement are given to outstanding records submitted by 4th – 6th grade members. Medals and certificates will be presented at the 4-H Recognition Dinner on October 9th, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. -3:00 p.m.
- High school juniors must submit a record book for evaluation to be eligible for the Tillamook County 4-H scholarships their senior year in high school.***
- Exhibit Release:** 4-H static exhibits including educational displays, home economics, natural resources, expressive arts, science, engineering & technology, and horticulture will be released from 9:00 to 10:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 13. No early exhibit pick up will be allowed. Those exhibits not picked up on Saturday evening may be picked up at the fairgrounds on Sunday, August 14, 8:00 am–5:00 pm. OSU Extension 4-H staff will not bring exhibits back to the OSU Extension Service office. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to make arrangements for exhibits to be picked up at the fairgrounds. Please note that there is no security for exhibits after Saturday evening of fair.
- Volunteers Needed:** Parents, Leaders & Teens - volunteers are needed to clerk, help with shows, judging contests, in the 4-H office at the fairgrounds and with other tasks. Let us know when and/or where you can help. Volunteers receive a free fair admission ticket for the day(s) they clerk. Contact Tanya Wehage at the OSU Extension Office, 503-842-3433 to volunteer to clerk or for other fair related tasks.
- Parents and youth ages 12 and up are also needed to scoop ice cream at the TCCA booth during fair. This is a fundraiser for the Tillamook 4-H program. Contact Debbie Crist, 503-812-3031.
- Meals:** Meals served in the kitchen at the 4-H Dorm are open to all 4-H members, leaders, families and friends. Meals should be ordered and paid for by Wednesday, July 13th. Use enclosed "4-H/FFA Kitchen Meals & Barbecue Order Form".

4-H Family and Friends Barbecue:

The 4-H family and friends barbecue is open to all 4-H members, leaders, families and friends. The BBQ will be Friday of fair from noon-1:15 p.m. at the 4-H Dorm. Order your barbecue meal on the “4-H/FFA Kitchen Meals & Barbecue Order Form” which is due Wednesday, July 13.

State Fair:

ANIMAL SCIENCE intermediate & senior exhibitors that have earned a blue ribbon in either showmanship or conformation/obedience who would like to exhibit at state fair must notify the OSU Extension Service office by **Tuesday, August 16.**

HORSE delegates for state fair (except western gaming) must notify the OSU Extension Service office of the classes they plan to enter at state fair by **Monday, August 1.** **WESTERN GAMING** delegates for state fair must notify the OSU Extension Service office by **Friday, August 12.**

Horse contestants, please refer to the State 4-H Horse section of the Oregon 4-H website for a complete list of rules and qualification requirements for state fair at <http://oregon.4h.oregonstate.edu/state-horse-fair>, or the State Fair 4-H premium book, or pick up a copy at the OSU Extension Office.

STATIC EXHIBITS: Junior, intermediate and senior 4-H members are eligible. Static exhibits are selected for state fair by the county fair judge, and a state fair sticker is placed on the exhibit tag by the clerk.

Members must submit state fair exhibits to the OSU Extension Service office by 5 p.m., **Tuesday, August 16** (exception: foods are due by 10 a.m., **Monday, August 22** and horticulture exhibits are due by 1 p.m. **Tuesday, Aug. 23**). 4-H Staff will transport your item(s) to/from state fair.

JUDGING CONTESTS: Intermediate and senior members who would like to participate on the State Fair team for dairy goat or poultry should contact the 4-H Fair Office or OSU Extension Service office immediately following the county fair contest or by **Tuesday, Aug. 16** at the latest to confirm their space on the team.

Award Nominations/ Applications:

Nomination and application forms for several awards given at fair or at the 4-H recognition program are available at the OSU Extension Service office. Applications are due on **Wednesday, July 13.** These include the:

- Live Animal Awards: The Tillamook County 4-H Program has four live animal awards that are presented annually. Information next page:

Jersey Award

Award: \$200 cash towards the purchase of a registered Jersey calf.

Eligibility: Any Tillamook County 4-H or F.F.A. member, 5th through 9th grade, with one year 4-H experience in a Dairy Project. Previous winners not eligible.

Requirements: Applicants must submit their dairy record books for judging. All entrants must show on the county level.

Kitty Callaway Memorial Calf Award

Award: A Brown Swiss calf for a youth to develop a Brown Swiss project.

Eligibility: Resident of Tillamook County in grades 6-9 during the 2010-11 year and have been enrolled in 4-H dairy cattle for a minimum of 2 years.

Requirements: Exhibit the award calf in 4-H at the 2012 Tillamook County Fair; interview with the award committee Wednesday of Fair and be present at the Replacement Heifer Sale on Thursday night of Fair.

Production Doe Goat Award

Award: A certificate for a purebred dairy doe goat kid.

Eligibility: 4-H members who are currently enrolled in the 4-H Goat Project

Requirements: Show the doe the following year in 4-H at the Tillamook County Fair; have the doe bred when appropriate, and use the doe for production; and keep official 4-H Goat Project Records.

Production Rabbit Award

Award: A purebred doe rabbit.

Eligibility: 4-H members who are currently enrolled in the 4-H Rabbit Project

Requirements: Show the doe the following year in 4-H at the Tillamook County Fair; have the doe bred when appropriate, and use the doe for production; and keep official 4-H Rabbit Project Records.

Dorm/Camping Policy:

The 4-H Dorm is open to all 4-H members showing animals at the Tillamook County Fair. First preference will be given to members who live over 10 miles from the fairgrounds. Members living closer to the fairgrounds will be eligible on a space available basis. (See enclosed dorm eligibility guidelines for specifics.) All dorm registrations must be submitted by **Wednesday, July 13th**.

Camping is at the discretion of the Tillamook County Fairboard. Fairboard policy requires youth under the age of 18 staying in overnight areas have an adult chaperon. 4-H and FFA members may camp only if the 4-H Dorm is full. For more information on camping policies at the Tillamook County Fair, contact the Tillamook County Fair office 842-2272.

Only youth registered to stay in the dorm and chaperones will be allowed upstairs in the dorm during fair week. (for security purposes)

HOME ECONOMICS

Fashion Revue: Judging of Fashion Revue will be on Wednesday, August 3 and Thursday, August 4. The public Fashion Revue will be in the auditorium (skating rink) on Thursday, August 4 at 7:00 p.m. 4-H members must attend both events to be eligible for ribbons, premiums, awards and state fair consideration.

4-H members must submit a written narration with their entry form by **Wednesday, July 13th**. The narration should be written in third person and be 75-150 words. Narrations can be e-mailed to nancy.kershaw@oregonstate.edu

Photos will be taken of the members wearing their garments on the day they are judged. These photos will be displayed on the garments during fair. Cost is **\$2.00** to cover printing expense.

ANIMAL SCIENCE

Livestock Judging Contests: The **State Livestock Judging Contest** will be held on **Saturday, July 9**, at the Marion County Fair. Registration will be at 8:30 am with the contest beginning at 9:00 am. All participants will judge 9 sets of animals (beef, sheep and swine and goats) both breeding and market. Contestants should be prepared to evaluate performance data on some classes. The contest will also include questions on one class. Seniors will give 3 sets of reasons while intermediates will give 2 sets. Contact the OSU Extension Service by **June 28** if you would like to participate.

The **Tillamook County Livestock Judging Contest – August 13**, will be held on Saturday during the Tillamook County Fair (August 13). The contest will begin at 9:30 am. Participants will judge classes of live animals (beef, sheep, meat goats, and swine) and hay. They will also complete an identification class that may include: feeds, equipment, meat cuts, breeds or body parts. Junior members will complete one set of oral reasons and Intermediate and Senior 4-H members will complete 2 sets of oral reasons. 4-H members should sign-up to participate by completing their 4-H fair entry form and turning it in by **July 13**.

Delivering Animals & Eggs All livestock and dairy animals must be in place by 8:00 p.m. Tuesday of fair. Small animals must be checked in from 4:00 to 7:00 p.m. Tuesday of fair. All small animals will be health checked and clerk sheets verified at check-in.

Eggs will be judged on Thursday following the poultry show. Eggs should be delivered to the poultry show ring on Thursday afternoon or, if they are delivered earlier, to the 4-H office in the 4-H exhibit area upstairs in the main exhibit building.

Health Checks: All animals brought to fair should be in good health. Animals with contagious diseases or parasites will not be allowed at fair. If a veterinarian is required to check on an animal at fair, it will be at the expense of the 4-H member.

Pullorum Testing: The Oregon State Department of Agriculture has required all classes of poultry,

regardless of source of stock, to be tested for Pullorum at the county fair.

Stall, Pen, Cage Requests:

4-H club leaders and independent members will be mailed a 4-H stall, pen & cage request form. All leaders and independent members must indicate the number of stalls, pens, or cages needed on the form. Stall, cage, and pen space may be limited. You are not guaranteed the amount of space requested. Please plan to pen animals together, when possible. Each club leader should fill out one form for the entire club. Stall, Pen & Cage Request forms are due at the OSU Extension Service office by **Wednesday, July 13.**

Passes For Feeding Animals:

Leaders and parents will be able to drive onto the fairgrounds to feed animals from 6 – 8 a.m. each day. Use the entry gate near the 4-H horse arena (enter from Brookfield Road). Vehicles must enter and leave by this gate. 4-H youth entering to feed animals, must have a 4-H bracelet to enter. No other adults or children will be allowed to enter through the gate without a pass.

Herdsmanship:

Judging of Herdsmanship will be from 10 a.m. - 7 p.m. Wednesday through Friday and 10 a.m. - noon Saturday. Guidelines for this contest are available at the OSU Extension Service office. All 4-H animal science exhibitors are required to participate; they are expected to do the cleaning, feeding and care of their own animal(s), and to cooperate with their club members and leaders.

Parking For Horse Trailers:

4-H horse exhibitors who trailer their horses to the 4-H Western Gaming show on Wednesday will be able to park their horse trailer on the east side of the gravel road by the 4-H horse arena. There will be no charge to the truck/horse trailer combinations. All other spectators must park in the designated public parking area (west side of the gravel road by the horse arena). A parking fee will be charged for public parking during fair.

4-H/FFA Membership:

4-H members who are also FFA members may not show the same animal in both programs. Members must use an animal that they exhibited in the 4-H division for their 4-H showmanship class. Only animals that were shown in the 4-H division at county fair are eligible to be shown at the state fair in the 4-H division. Animals shown in 4-H at County Fair cannot be shown in FFA at State Fair and vice versa.

Market Animal: All members who have market animals must turn in the Tillamook County Market Animal Record and the Junior Livestock Auction Committee Memorandum of Understanding to the Livestock Barn Office by 9 p.m. Tuesday of fair. Beef exhibitors must also submit a transportation certificate and brand inspection forms at that time.

It is the responsibility of the OSU Extension Service, Tillamook County 4-H program to provide educational materials and workshops to leaders and members enrolled in the 4-H Market Animal Program. The final portion of the educational program is the evaluation and judging provided through the 4-H/FFA Market Animal Show at the Tillamook County Fair. The Tillamook County 4-H/FFA Junior Livestock Auction Committee is responsible for Market Animal rules and for conducting the auction.

JLAC Awards All 4-H members participating in the Junior Livestock Auction need to be at the livestock ring at 5:30 pm (prior to the auction) on Friday of fair for the JLAC awards program.

Important Sheep and Goat Information: Regulations have been developed in hopes of eradicating scrapie in the United States. Scrapie is a transmissible spongiform encephalopathy (TSE) disorder in sheep and goats.

As of November 19, 2001, all breeding ewes, rams, and lambs, (wethers included); and all dairy, angora, meat, and pygmy goats (under 18 months of age) that will be shown or sold will need to be ear tagged with a USDA scrapie identification tag. Stay-at-home animals do not need to be tagged. Tags and tag applicators are free of charge and can be acquired by calling the USDA office in Salem at 866-873-2824. Sellers must provide flock of origin information at time of sale. Records must be retained for five years. We are requesting that all local producers (youth and adults) get the tags and account for their own animals.

Master Showmanship: The Small Animal Master Showmanship contest will be held on Thursday of fair for rabbit, cavy, poultry and pigeons. The Large Animal Master Showmanship contest will be held Saturday of fair for dairy, beef, sheep, swine, dairy goat and meat goat. The champion showman for each age division (junior, intermediate, senior) is eligible to participate. Novice showmen do not participate in Master Showmanship. If a 4-H member does not choose to participate in Master Showmanship, they must notify the 4-H livestock office immediately after their showmanship class so that the next person eligible has time to prepare.

Animal Release: All animals will be released at 8 p.m. on Saturday of fair. No early releases will be allowed.
