### Enrollment

Enrollment packets contain: club enrollment form, club financial summary form, leader enrollment form(s), member enrollment form(s), and appropriate project and insurance fees.

For uninterrupted mailing of your newsletter, we recommend that all enrollment is done by December 31.

**\*\*Did you know that new leaders must complete an application form, have their references checked, and attend a "New Leader Training" before they can participate as a club leader? This is also the way new leaders are covered by our insurance policy. Please check with your new leaders to make sure that they have an application form on file with our office and they have completed their "New Leader Training."**

The next new leader training is scheduled for December 6 from 5:30 - 7:30 in the Ag Service Center Conference room.

### Club Financial Reports Due

**\$** The 4-H Leaders Association is required to submit to the state an account of all money earned in the name of 4-H. Even if you have not earned any money in your club, you still need to turn in the form to the Extension Office. Forms will be mailed in December to primary club leaders.

### FUND RAISING AND 4-H CLUBS

As clubs get started in the new 4-H year, many are thinking about ways to raise money for club expenses. One of the options that may be used is a fundraiser. If your club is considering a fundraiser, be sure you complete an *Intent to Conduct a Fund Raising* form and submit to the 4-H office for approval at least two weeks PRIOR to advertizing your event. You can pick up a form from our website at:

Note: All 4-H events that are educational activities are

covered by the member and leader insurance, however, fundraisers are not considered educational under the legal interpretation so the regular 4-H insurance isn't in effect. However, there is additional Special Activities Coverage available at a minimal cost. The cost for this additional insurance ranges from \$.15 to \$.23 per person per day. The application form must be completed and postmarked or approved by phone one day prior to the effective date. Contact the office for additional information.

### Rural Youth Loans for Agriculture Projects

The Farm Service Agency is offering Rural Youth Loans for as much as \$5,000 for students ages 10 to 20 who want to start their own businesses. Examples of appropriate projects are lawn and garden services, repair shops, livestock and crop production and roadside produce stands. These loans can be used to buy livestock, equipment and supplies; to pay operating expenses; to buy, rent or repair tools and equipment.
