EXHIBITORS RULES

1. No other animals allowed on the grounds other than exhibits for this show.
2. Exhibitors must have owned and cared for their animals from the time they were started on feed.
3. No animal may be entered in more than one class.
4. Exhibitors are limited to two exhibits per person. An exhibitor may enter more than one class of livestock. Exhibitors may enter only one division - 4-H or FFA within a species.
5. FFA Chapters or 4-H Clubs exhibiting as a cooperative exhibit shall abide by the same rules as the individual exhibitor.
6. Agents and instructors may make all entries for their counties or chapters.
7. Bedding will be available. Donations will be accepted.
8. Exhibitors must keep pens in show condition to qualify for awards.
9. Exhibitors must provide their own feeding and watering equipment.
10. FFA Chapter advisors or authorized substitute and county agents or designated 4-H Leaders are responsible for their Chapter and County's delegation's conduct while attending the show. Any problems not settled by those responsible will be brought before the rules enforcement committee whose action will be final.
11. Animals can be exhibited at the show by other than the owners if illness or accident during the show prevents the owner from showing the animal. However, a bona fide 4-H or FFA member in his or her place should show these animals. The Show Board shall review all of these cases.
12. The superintendent has the authority to change classes to fit the livestock entries.
13. CHECK OUT AND RELEASE OF ANIMALS. All animals leaving the show must be checked out through the person authorized by the Show Board for this purpose. Proper checks out papers from the Show Auction office are required. No animals will be released until after the sale. Beef should have proper destination papers and brand transfer slips. Be sure to clean the straw out of your pens before you leave the show. All stalls must be cleaned before exhibitor leaves the sale. A \$20.00 per pen cleaning fee will be deducted from sale proceeds for each pen not cleaned.
14. Stall cards should be in place by 8:00 a.m. Friday.
15. Insurance coverage for 4-H and FFA registered at the show is in force only on the grounds or while participating in sponsored events.
16. All animals brought for exhibition is at the owners risk. The Show Board will not be held responsible for injuries incurred by animals or injuries or damages inflicted on a third party by said animals and in no event will be held liable for the death of an animal.
17. The Show Board shall select a committee for the specific purpose of supervising and enforcing rules and regulations as outlined in this booklet.

GENERAL SALE RULES

SALE ORDER - Beginning at 9:15 a.m. Swine – Beef – Lambs

Prior to the sale, all buyers must register at the sale office and receive a bidders number.

1. All purchases must be paid for at the office prior to release of the animals unless prior arrangements have been made. Checks should be payable to Mid Columbia Junior Livestock Show and delivered to the office following the auction.
2. All animals that make weight are consigned to the Mid-Columbia Junior Livestock Show for sale.
3. Sale weight, ear tag number and seller's name will be shown in sale catalog.
4. All bidding will be on a pound basis.
5. Animals designated resale at time of sale cannot be repurchased.
6. The total bid price must be paid to the Mid-Columbia Junior Livestock Show, not just the commission, on any animal bought back by the exhibitor (includes exhibitor's immediate family).
7. A maximum of 5 percent of gross sale and all add-on support handled through the show books will be withheld for expense.
8. White ribbon animals cannot be sold through auction.
9. Animals will be sold in the order of ribbon placing. 1st-Blue, 2nd-Red. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion animals will sell one and two for 4-H and FFA. Sales will alternate 4H and FFA entries wherever possible.
10. Only one weight permitted. Animals with weights in question will be taken off scale, scale rebalanced, and animal re-weighed immediately. New weight will stand. Weighing to be performed by show appointed weigh masters only. All published weight limitations will be enforced. Prior to show, scales are checked and certified by State Weights and Measures Division.
11. All exhibitors must be on call at their exhibits during the auction sale unless previously excused. Failure to comply could result in the loss of the sale of their animals.
12. Exhibitors having sifted animals must make their own arrangements for selling those animals. The Show Board cannot be responsible for these animals.
13. The sale order between 4-H and FFA top animals are to be alternated with the 4-H selling first on odd years and FFA first on even years.
14. If an animal is condemned at slaughter for health reasons, it will be the seller's responsibility, not the show's or the buyer's.
15. Allow approximately one month for your money from sale of animals.
16. **The sale office will not mail out billings of less than \$50.00.** Please make payment arrangements with the office prior to the sale.
17. Exhibitors must bring their pledges and add-on support to the office in the form of cash or a check made out to the Mid-Columbia Jr. Livestock Show prior to the sale.

ALL OVERWEIGHT AND UNDERWEIGHT ANIMALS MUST BE OUT OF THE BARN BY 9 A.M. SALE DAY.

BEEF

1,100-pound minimum

RULES

1. Only steers will be eligible.
2. Steers with horns or scurs cannot be entered in the show.
3. All steers must be fitted and be halter broke.
4. Steers are to be double tied in stalls and while washing.
5. Steers sold must be left tied with rope halters.
6. Show halters are required in the show rings.
7. White ribbon steers may be used for Showmanship, but may not be sold at auction.
8. BEEF CLASS - MARKET STEER: All breeds competing will be set up in classes according to animal weights. Classes will be posted. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the class order and to bring his or her animal to the proper class.
9. **If more than 20 steers are entered, 4-H and FFA will show separately.**
10. **BRAND INSPECTION:** according to the law in effect at show time will be enforced. Evidence of ownership must accompany each beef exhibit and this evidence **must be turned in at the scales when weighing in.** This includes a transportation slip covering all animals and a blue change of ownership certificate for all animals bearing a brand. This is a requirement even if the brand is registered in the name of the exhibitor's parents. Beef coming from Washington must have a Washington Brand Inspection Certificate.

SPECIAL BEEF RE-SALE RULES

1. All show market steer live grades will be considered as estimates, with the show not responsible for live grade. The estimated value of market steers will be used only to establish a minimum sale bid price.
2. Exhibitors with steers going to slaughter as resale animals will be paid the carcass rail value for the animal, plus the dollar amount bid above the announced minimum bid price at the auction sale, less the sale's commission.
3. Exhibitors with steers going directly to the buyer for locker meat will receive the sale transaction price less the sale's commission.

LAMBS

100 to 140 pounds

RULES

1. Only wether or ewe lambs will be eligible.
2. Lambs not properly castrated will not be eligible to be shown or sold. Testicles must be removed from body.
3. White ribbon lambs may be used for Showmanship, but may not be sold at auction.
4. All lambs must be sheared before weighing in, with wool depth being 1/4 inch.
5. LAMB CLASS - MARKET LAMB: All breeds competing will be set up in classes according to animal weights. Classes will be posted. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the class order and to bring his or her animal to the proper class.

RIBBON RECOGNITION

1. Champion and Reserve Champion of each class for 4-H and FFA.
2. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion for 4-H and FFA.

BUCKLE AWARDS

Presented to Grand Champion and Reserve Champion for 4-H and FFA.

SWINE

240 to 290 pounds

RULES

1. Only barrow or gilt hogs will be eligible.
2. **No artificial substances, such as oil or powder, may be used in fitting of swine.**
3. **¼" minimum body hair length. Ears and tails may be clipped close.**
4. White ribbon hogs may be used for Showmanship, but may not be sold at auction.
5. SWINE CLASS - MARKET HOG - All breeds competing will be set up in classes according to animal weights. Classes will be posted. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know the class order and to bring his or her animal to the proper class.
6. The show board reserves the right to ring any hog causing disturbance.

RIBBON RECOGNITION

1. Champion and Reserve Champion of each class for 4-H and FFA.
2. Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion for 4-H and FFA

BUCKLE AWARDS

Presented to Grand Champion and Reserve Champion for 4-H and FFA.

SHOWMANSHIP

1. Contestants shall show their own animals. Ear tags will be checked. Breed type and conformation will not be considered. All fitting shall be done prior to the contest.
2. Overweight and underweight animals shall not be permitted to be used in showmanship unless the 4-H and FFA member has no other animals in the show.

4H / FFA BEEF SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

1. Beef - Due to low numbers of beef exhibits, 4-H and FFA will compete together in showmanship. The 2 top showmen selected will be the Grand and Reserve Champions regardless if they are 4-H or FFA members. In the event that both are 4-H or both are FFA, an alternate will be selected to participate in the All Around Showmanship.
2. **If more than 20 exhibitors, 4-H and FFA will show separately.**

FFA LAMB AND SWINE SHOWMANSHIP CLASSES

SHOWMANSHIP RUN-OFFS

Class Champion Showmanship shall be a NEW CONTEST. 1st and 2nd place winners from the Junior, Intermediate, Senior and FFA classes will participate within their own age group. If an exhibitor becomes champion showman in two animal areas, this exhibitor shall have the choice of animal area to enter and the reserve champion will step up in the other animal area.

JUDGING CONTEST

KATHY HOLMES, SUPERINTENDENT

Contest is open to all 4H members and FFA members. Teams must consist of a minimum of three and a maximum of five members from within the same 4H Club or FFA Chapter. 4-H JUDGING TEAMS MUST BE DESIGNATED PRIOR TO THE CONTEST. Top three scores will be used as team scores. Leaders and Advisors may pre-register their judging teams on forms provided in the show pre-registration package. Confirm registration and pick up supplies before the contest begins at the show office. The Hormel scoring method will be used. Awards will be on an individual and team basis. FFA alternate judges are eligible for individual awards.

Awards to FFA Winners 1st, 2nd and 3rd teams; Banners
1st (individual); Banner
Appropriate certificates to top 10 individuals.

Awards to 4-H Winners 1st, 2nd and 3rd teams; Banners
Overall high individual; Banner
Appropriate certificates to top ten Senior, Intermediate and Junior individuals.

HERDSMANSHIP

HERDSMANSHIP IS IMPORTANT

Basis for Scoring

Exhibitors earn points by maintaining clean, neat stalls. Barns that are clean and orderly, including alleys, stalls and pens, earn points. Points are earned if your animal remains securely tied or penned and is kept clean and comfortable. Your animal(s) must be regularly fed and cared for. If your feed, equipment and stall cards are in place and orderly, points will be added. Participants who are friendly, courteous, and cooperative and conduct themselves in a manner that will make their club or county proud will earn points. When the appearance of your stall is poor, points are deducted. When animals are neglected or noticeably distressed, points will be deducted. When these areas are in poor condition, points are deducted.
