| 7% Iodine (for navels) | Gloves |
| Disinfectant soap (Betadine®, Nolvasan®) | Sleeves |
| Syringes (TB, 3cc, 6cc, 12cc, 60cc dose) | Aspiration bulb (for kids' noses) |
| Needles (22, 20, 18 gauge) | Scalpel blades |
| Propylene glycol (to treat ketosis) | Mastitis medication |
| Uterine prolapse retainers (prolapse paddles) | Clippers |
| Injectable antibiotics (penicillin, etc.) | Sweaters (for chilled kids) |
| Surgical instruments (scissors, hemostats) | Ear tags, tagger and/or tattooer |
| Uterine boli | Paint sticks/marketing crayons |
| OB lubricant | Castration equipment |
| OB equipment (head snare, straps/chains) | Clean towels |
| Thermometers | 4X4 gauze squares or cotton wads |
| Dextrose | Clean stainless steel pail |
| Feeding tubes | Pelt knife (for grafting) |
| Frozen colostrum | Fly repellent |
| Clostridium C, D, and T antitoxin | Oxytocin (for uterine contraction, milk letdown) |
| Injectable selenium (Bo-Se®) | Lidocaine (for nerve blocks) |
| Epinephrine (adrenaline) | Banamine® (for pain, inflammation, fever) |
| Stethoscope | Styptic pencil (for patent urachus) |
| Aspirin (for fever, inflammation) | Electrolytes (for scours) |
| Dopram® (respiratory stimulant) | Umbilical tape (for prolapses) |
| Hydrogen peroxide | Heat lamp |
