Find the art stick temporary installations that mark the participating sites

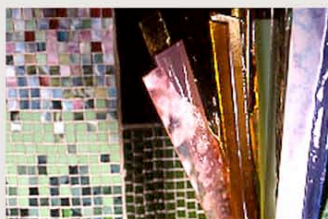
Walkabout: "a period of wandering" or an adventure with no itinerary!

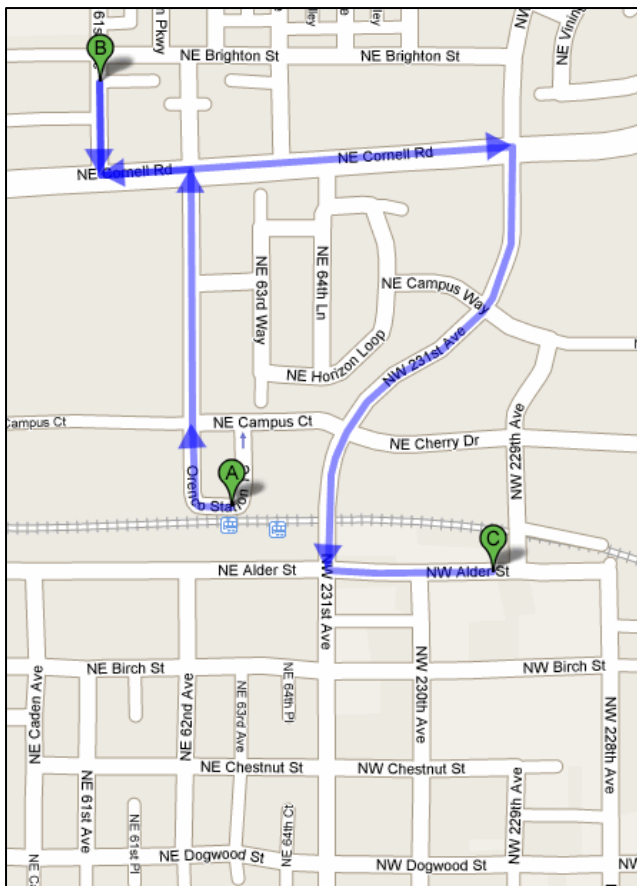
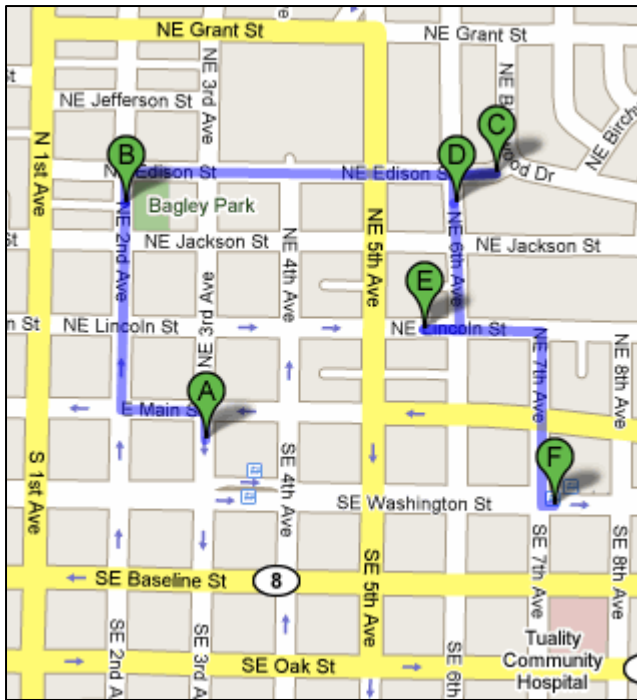

Heart of Hillsboro

A - Art Envy, 125 SE 3rd Avenue
Pick up Walkabout map guide

B - 337 NE 2nd Avenue (across from Bagley park)
This house, built in 1909, is the home of **Jay Hamlin and Kay Demlow**. Kay is the owner, researcher and primary dressmaker for Lavender's Green Historic Clothing. She designs and makes replica garments for historic sites in the United States and Canada. She occasionally paints and gardens, as well.

C - 624 NE Edison Street
See Glass Mosaics demonstration by artist, **Linda Haworth**, who does cast glass and glass mosaics for Public Art. Richly colored glass fragments sparkle in the sunlight and will last a thousand years! Linda completed two light rail stations in glass and clay mosaics and has recently been awarded a SW Portland Fire Station 18 Public Art commission.

The **Wagnell family (Mark, Robyn, Eli, & Sadie)** will demonstrate stamp design and carving. "Letterboxing is an intriguing pastime combining navigational skills and rubber stamp artistry in a treasure hunt style outdoor quest." Learn about Hillsboro's hidden letterbox locations.

D - Friends Church, 332 NE 6th Avenue
Recycling experts, **Aymie Reynolds and Heather Robinson**, will help you bring out your inner artist. Put together art from recycled materials, make totems and have a blast! Fun for the kids and the kid within you!

E - 545 NE Lincoln St
As part of the first Walkabout, **Tim and Joyce Gabriel** will be showing a variety of watercolor and pen and ink techniques. With forge and anvil, Tim will demonstrate the art of blacksmithing by heating, scribing, twisting, hammering and tapering hot metal.

F - Tuality Hospital/SE 8th Ave MAX Station

C - Robert Lewis' Wheelwright Shop, 22930 NW Alder Street
At the corner of 229th and Alder, the original mercantile building is the center of Orencia's neighborhood heritage celebration activities and the starting place for a historic homes walking tour! Enjoy the parade at 2 p.m. Climbing into a reproduction stagecoach and watching blacksmiths crafting a wagon wheel will be highlights of the Orencia area festivities.
