This contest is open to 4-H Members enrolled in the 4-H Rifle project. Participant must be in good standing in a 4-H Rifle Club led by a qualified Leader (must be a certified Oregon 4-H Master Shooting Sports Instructor). All Oregon 4-H Shooting Sports Programs will be taught as a group project activity. The program is not open as an independent 4-H project.

ALL RIFLES MUST BE UNLOADED AND STORED IN A RIFLE CASE. THE RIFLE WILL ONLY BE PERMITTED TO BE REMOVED FROM THE CASE INSIDE THE PERMITTED RANGE AREA. TRANSPORTATION OF AIR RIFLES TO AND FROM THE RANGE SHALL BE UNDER THE DIRECT SUPERVISION OF A RESPONSIBLE INDIVIDUAL OF AT LEAST 21 YEARS OF AGE.

Equipment: The following equipment will be permitted for use; Offhand stands, shooting mats, loading blocks, kneeling rolls, binoculars or spotting scopes and any other equipment deemed by the Master Rifle Instructor of that club. Any equipment used in the compaction that supports the rifle or shooter while firing will not be allowed. (IE: back brace, or resting on the offhand stand while pulling the trigger for a scoring shot.)

National standard three position sporter air rifle

Target: NRA AR 5/10

Distance: 10 meters or 33 feet

Course of fire: 3x10. 10 shots each position: prone, standing and sitting in that order. (30 record shots)

Time Limit: 1 ½ minutes per shot prone, 1 ½ minutes per shot kneeling, 2 minutes per shot standing.

Equipment: .177 caliber air rifles under 7.5 pounds with metallic sights are permitted. Trigger pull must be minimum of 1 ½ lbs. Rifles that are officially approved include Daisy 753/853/953, Daisy 888, Daisy XSV40 and Crosman 2000. Any rifle as stated in the National Standard Rules may be submitted for a decision prior to the competition and may be added to the list of approved rifles.

Clothing: A shooting glove may be worn, but no shooting jackets are permitted.

This team course will only be fired if time permits. In case the course is not fired, your individual score will be combined with your team mates for a team score. Each team must consist of at least 1 person per level, except for the senior level. The senior will be the "Team Captain". Senior (only 1), intermediate and a junior. The 4th member can be another intermediate or junior.

BB Gun

County Only

Equipment: The Daisy 499 series BB gun is recommended.

Rifles: Any safe, factory smoothbore BB gun weighing a total of six (6) pounds or less may be used. **Sights:** Metallic sights only. Rear sights with eyecups and any hooded front site that extends beyond the muzzle may not be used. Any rifle as stated in the National Standard Rules may be submitted for a decision prior to the competition and may be added to the list of approved rifles. Blinders are permitted.

Targets: AR-4/10 targets (10 bull's-eyes).

Distance: 5 meters

Course of Fire: 3x10, 10 shots each position.

Time Limit: Ten minutes will be allowed to fire all ten shots for each position. Unlimited sighting shots are permitted, but must be fired within the ten minute time limit.

Safety Equipment: Eye protection is required during this event by the 4-H rules.

This contest is open to 4-H Members enrolled in the 4-H Archery project. Participant must be in good standing in a 4-H Archery Club led by a qualified Leader (must be a certified Oregon 4-H Master Shooting Sports Instructor). All Oregon 4-H Shooting Sports Programs will be taught as a group project activity. The program is not open as an independent 4-H project.

Any of the following bows may be used: Long Bow, Recurved Bow or Compound Bow not to exceed a draw weight of 40lbs.

BARE BOW – is a style of shooting **without** a bow sight and using a finger tab or a shooting glove.
