Read Animal Science Rules and Health Requirements. All exhibitors are expected to attend the exhibitor meetings each day.”

Each exhibitor may exhibit two animals per class number but cannot exceed seven animals per department. Animals showing any evidence of prolapse or mechanical repair will not be allowed. Animals must be registered in members name to be eligible to receive Breed Association Awards. All sheep must be fitted by the 4-H exhibitor.

Wool on all market lambs, may not be longer than 1/2 inch at time of final weigh-in and will be measured at the scales. Lambs must be freshly shorn before they come to fairgrounds for final weigh-in. Southdown **MUST** be exhibited slick shorn. Slick shorn is defined as, being shorn completely to the hide within 5 days of the show date. The wool may be left from the rear hocks down

and the front knees down plus the wool cap defined as from the ears and poll forward.

No slick shorn in Natural Colored Wool classes. Wool must be a minimum of 3/4 inch long. Animals are judged 60% on fleece.

WOOL AND MOHAIR

Each member is limited to one fleece in a class with a maximum of 6 fleeces. Fleeces must have been shorn in 2008 from animals owned by the 4-H member. Each fleece must have a 4-H Wool Show Tag indicating the breed and class number. Place fleeces in a clear plastic bag. The 4-H Wool Show Tag should be inserted inside the bag and visible through the bag. Judging criteria are outlined on 4-H Fleece Exhibit Score Card (40-610) available at the county Extension office or on the State 4-H website at <http://oregon.4h.oregonstate.edu/resources/materials>.

Each exhibitor may exhibit two animals per class number but cannot exceed seven animals per department.

- All animals must be properly cared for by the 4-H member. Proper care is defined as adequate food and water at scheduled times and pens thoroughly cleaned daily.
- Must be a minimum of 4 entries in a purebred class or will show in All Other Breeds class.
- All hogs must be fed commercial feed only.

- No body clipping allowed on hogs. Check Auction rules as well.
- All hogs must be clean to enter the scales at the time of final weigh-in.
- Any gilt tagged as a market hog must be shown in market class and NOT eligible to show as a breeding gilt.
- **All exhibitors will attend herdsmanship meetings each day.**
- **All exhibitors will provide completed copies of the Swine Health Records for each Swine exhibited.**

Any animals found to have lice, lice eggs, open sores, tumors, abscesses, large hernias, and or warts upon arrival on haul-in day will not be unloaded and will return to their home facility. If the above issues are found while the animal is at fair it will be quarantined to its pen and will be removed by owner and/or owner will take any other measures as directed by the Swine Superintendent.
