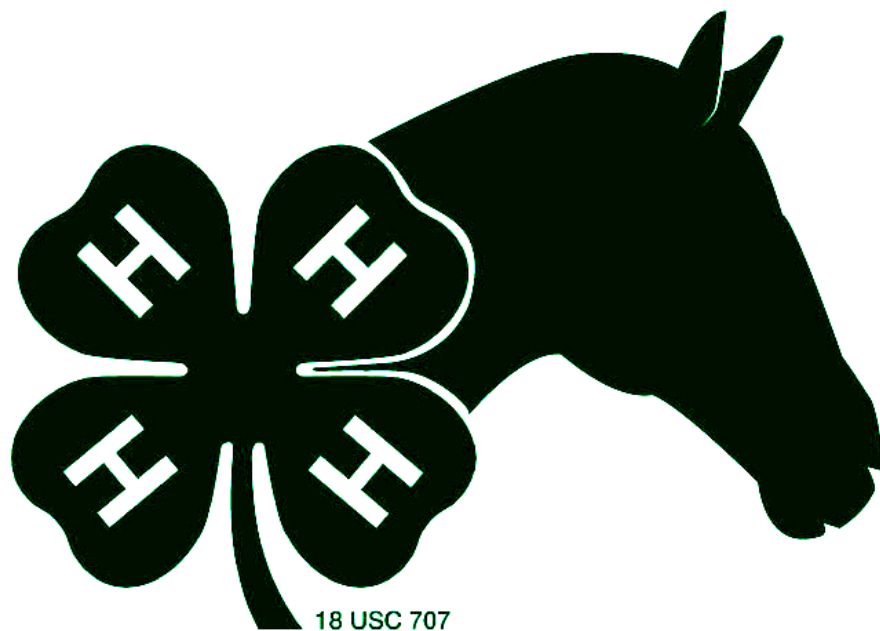


Lake County 4-H Horse Show

Superintendents

Superintendents are responsible for coordinating volunteers, facilitating set up of equipment, enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct and all state 4-H rules, and insuring safety. Entry Deadline

A completed entry form must be submitted to the Extension Office by 5:00 pm on Monday, July 24th.

Contest Guide

Please review the 4-H Horse Contest Guide and the 4-H Ranch Horse Contest Guide before the show. Contest Guides may be picked up at the Extension Office or online at Oregon.4h.oregonstate.edu under "Projects."

Possession

Members may show one or more of their owned, leased, or shared project horses, ponies, donkeys, or mules. They should do all grooming and most of the training in preparation for showing. Juniors may receive additional help. **Members must ride, show, or exhibit horses they have owned or leased and personally trained for 90 days prior to the county (4-H Horse Show) and state fair.**

Record Book Deadline

All 4-H members are required to complete a 4-H record book prior to exhibiting at the Lake County 4-H Horse Show. Refer to the Lake County 4-H Member Handbook for more information and guidelines on record books. Record books must be turned in to the Extension Office by 5:00 pm on the first Friday in August.

Advancements and Completion Checklist

4-H advancement programs consist of a series of steps that provide a framework for progressive learning within a specific project area. Advancement programs allow 4-H members to move at their own speed and encourage self-learning that is based on members' interests and abilities. Advancement programs are self-paced, age- and skill-level appropriate, and can be a tremendous help to members as they set their goals each year. In addition, advancement programs are useful to Junior Leaders and more experienced 4-H members who wish to work with younger or less-experienced members.

Mandatory:

- To compete at the Horse Show in showmanship, members must first complete the Level 1 Ground Work Advancements.
- To compete at the Horse Show in any riding class, members must first complete the Level 1 Riding Advancements.
- To compete at the Horse Show in any specialty advancement area (such as jumping) or any ranch horse advancement area (such as roping or cow working), members must first complete the Level 1 Advancements for that specific area.

A copy of your Advancements and Completion Checklist are due at the time of registration, the original copy is to be placed in your 4-H Record Book.

Showmanship

4-H members must exhibit in a horse showmanship class in order to participate in the Lake County 4-H Horse Show. Showmanship will be offered on Saturday and Ranch Horse Showmanship will be offered on Sunday.

County Only Classes

These are open to all Lake County 4-H members. No premiums or rosette ribbons will be awarded. The scores for these classes will not be used for high point or qualifying for State Fair.

Patterns

Patterns will be available on the first morning of the Horse Show.

Proof of Age Required

4-H members are required to provide proof of age for the horse used in Ground Training and Green Horse. The preferred method to provide proof of age is to submit a copy of the horse's registration papers (or other approved paperwork) with the entry form. If a member cannot provide paperwork, please contact the Extension Office by the entry deadline to make other arrangements. Use the appropriate scoring guide and maneuver list provided at extension.oregonstate.edu/lake/4-h-resources-forms.

Green Horse

Mission: To encourage 4-H members to ride and train young horses. This class is open to horses five years old and younger. The horse may have been started or trained by the 4-H member or any other person, prior to 90 days before the Horse Show. **In the 90 days before the Horse Show, the horse must be trained by the 4-H member only.** Lease and ownership rules are enforced.

Recognition Ceremony

A ceremony will be held half an hour after the last class on Sunday at the fairgrounds. This time will be used to recognize all those involved in the show and celebrate accomplishments. Champion ribbons will be awarded at this time.

High point buckles will be awarded to the junior, intermediate, and senior with the total highest scores in the following classes: Showmanship, Equitation (either English or Western), Trail, and a second Equitation class or Hunt Seat Over Fences (whichever has the highest score). A Ranch Horse buckle will be awarded to the member with the highest score in the following classes: Ranch Horse Showmanship, Working Ranch Horse, Cow Work, Roping, and Ranch Horse Trail.

General Information

- Well-behaved dogs on leashes are allowed in designated areas.
- **Only entered Horse Show participants are allowed on horseback** An exception will be made for members of show management who have signed the short-term volunteer form and are assisting with Cow Work on Ranch Horse day.
- Spectators, please remember to be courteous to participants and do not cause distractions.
- No racing of horses on the track or any other area on the fairgrounds.
