Dear Garden Enthusiast,

Thank you for your interest in the OSU Master Gardener™ program! Becoming a Master Gardener is really exciting. It is an opportunity to learn new things, share what you know, and join a community of people who share a love of plants, insects, and how we get to participate with it all through gardening.

Every year we are asked what we are looking for in new Master Gardeners. Our main requirement is a love and enthusiasm for gardening and a desire to share that love with others. Most Master Gardeners have at least two or three years of gardening experience before they join the program, but we do not require extensive knowledge.

Being a Master Gardener consists of:

- 42 hours of training over 7 weeks that will provide you with new and interesting gardening knowledge. These classes are taught by OSU faculty and other horticultural specialists. They will be held on Wednesdays from 9am-4pm between February 19 and April 1, 2020. All classes will be held at St. Paul's Episcopal Church in The Dalles (1805 Minnesota St.), in Tayler Hall (downstairs). In order to get your 42 hours of training, you will be required to attend all classes (see training schedule for details).
- Contributing 42 hours of your time *-service hours-* in extending information to home gardeners. This is the part of your training where you get to put your learning into action! Master Gardeners are community educators and most of our projects are group efforts. During your first year as a Master-Gardener-in-training, your service hours are considered a practicum, or hands-on continued training. You are not expected to be an expert, and volunteering is where most of the learning happens.

Time can be volunteered in any number of fun and interesting activities, including:

- Helping community members solve their gardening problems in plant clinic. (This is the heart of the Master Gardener program, and all volunteers participate in plant clinics.)
- Maintaining The DIG garden beds or teaching workshops there.
- Writing editorials about your newest garden experiments in our monthly newsletter.
- Teaching children about pollination through games and activities at our after-school garden club.
- In your second year and beyond in the program, you can volunteer in our greenhouse project, mentoring detained youth at NORCOR. (First year trainees will not participate in the greenhouse, but can and should! volunteer for the plant sale.)

Tuition for Master Gardener training is \$90, which includes your text book, and \$15 for in Association dues. This is actually the least expensive Master Gardener program in Oregon! However, I know the cost can be prohibitive, and thanks to our Wasco County Master Gardener Association, there are some scholarship funds available; application for the scholarship is included in this packet.

In order for you to be considered for the program, we must receive your completed application form and check by **5:00 pm on Thursday, December 12, 2019**. **Late applications will not be accepted for consideration**. Please complete your application, showing your interests, abilities and availability to complete the entire program.

There will be a Master Gardener Orientation on Wednesday, January 15 at 6:00pm at The Dalles Senior Center. At this orientation, you'll get a chance to receive your text book and other program materials, learn more about the program, and meet other Master Gardeners. Please plan to attend!
