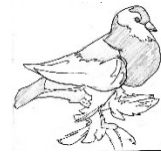
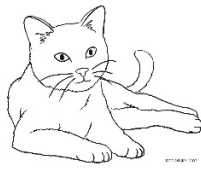


# State Fair 4-H Small Animal Exhibitors



***Check with your Superintendent to see if you qualify!***

**Selection:** A blue ribbon in either showmanship or conformation at County Fair is the basic qualification for participation in State Fair. Each project area has a maximum number of members that they can send. Higher placings will determine who gets to participate if there are more members interested than the quota allows.

State Fair 4-H participation is a privilege earned through demonstrated excellence as an exhibitor, gracious sportsmanship, proper and attentive herdsmanship, and last (but certainly not least), appropriate personal behavior at all times. Superintendents have the right and responsibility to refuse entries from those who have not taken proper care of their animals or who have demonstrated poor personal behavior.

**Chaperones:** Each project area will have one Official Chaperone to direct the county delegation. Each member must have a personal chaperone (age 21 or over) with them at the state fair.

Those planning to stay overnight need to consider lodging arrangements. Any youth staying in the camping area must have an adult chaperone (age 25 or older) stay with them.

# **State Fair Small Animal Entry Application**

This form is to be filled out and turned into the Superintendent, 4-H Agent or the 4-H Hall office Friday, August 16 following the meeting. No entries will be accepted after 7:30 pm Friday evening.

## **When choosing classes, remember that:**

1. Showmanship is required. Cats and Herptiles enter only the appropriate Companion Pet Class.
2. Your Showmanship animal must be entered in a conformation class.
3. You may enter two entries in the same conformation class if the animals are different breeds or varieties.
4. You may enter a maximum of 6 animals each in rabbit, cavy, pigeon and poultry, and two per class in companion pets.
5. Animals must have been shown at County Fair or otherwise met the county qualification requirements as determined by the Superintendent and Agent.
6. If your animal went through the livestock auction sale, you may **not** enter it in State Fair.
