Diamond D Dazzlers Code of Conduct and Guidelines for Members, Leaders, and Parents

LEADERS:

- 1. Carry through on commitments.
- 2. Be positive, easy to approach, friendly, agreeable.
- 3. Be fair and impartial.
- 4. Be strict, but not unreasonably so.
- 5. Communicate with all involved in group.
- 6. Have consistent meeting times, be on time, and avoid cancellations.
- 7. Have needed information and materials.
- 8. Have members enrolled by deadline dates for Fair participation.
 - a. Current deadlines:
 - i. Member January 15
 - ii. Horse April 1
- 9. Be responsible for determining if horse and/or rider are safe to participate in Fair. No unsafe horses or riders who cannot control their horses will be allowed to show at Fair.

MEMBERS:

- 1. Show positive interest in and commitment to project horse.
- 2. Show respect at all times to leaders and parents.
- 3. Be cooperative and show good sportsmanship.
- 4. Participate in activities, meetings and events.
- 5. Be on time saddled and ready to ride by 6:30 on riding nights.
- 6. Keep parents informed.
- 7. Keep records up to date ask for help if needed.
- 8. Maintain safe and kind handling of horses at all times.
- 9. Helmets, boots and long pants must be worn at all times when working with horse.
- 10. No "goofing off," uncontrolled riding, double riding, or bareback riding during 4-H meeetings.
- 11. Be responsible!
 - a. Do your buddy responsibilities or re-designate them to someone else.
 - b. Be willing to help in stressful or emergency situations.

12. AT FAIR

- a. Have a parent or legal guardian (in writing prior to fair) at Fair with you.
- b. Be helpful with herdsmanship even if you are not showing. Take problems to the hersmanship captains.
- c. Be responsible with buddy system.

- d. Be on time for events you are responsible to now your times and to let buddies, leaders and parents know your times.
- e. Take responsibility to know your patterns.
- f. No siblings or nonmembers will do herdsmanship.
- g. Always show good sportsmanship.

PARENTS

- 1. Support child in project be positive.
 - a. On time to meetings, events, activities.
 - b. Supply needed tack and supplies.
 - c. Supply needed transportation.
- 2. Show same respect to members and leaders that you expect from them.
- 3. Let youth do their project themselves.
- 4. Be willing to volunteer time to help with activities or special tasks, fundraisers, etc.
 - a. Current volunteers:
 - i. Kathi Records
 - ii. Lori Community Project
 - iii. Jeanne Organize Pre-Fair Packets.
- 5. Be present at or have designated guardian at meetings.
- 6. Be willing to attend occasional advisory meetings (if Linda cannot).
- 7. Help set up and take down equipment at riding meetings.
- 8. Disciplinary actions to your child must be done away from 4-H activity.
- 9. **FAIR:**
 - a. Be there or have a designated (in writing) legal guardian (21 years old or older).
 - b. Be willing to help with meals and other necessary tasks.
 - c. Be willing to help with set-up, decorations, and clean up.
 - d. No member siblings are to be at fair without parent or appointed guardian.
 - e. No siblings will do hersmanship or will be at horse barn without their parent.

CONSEQUENCES:

Failure to abide by the Code of Conduct and Guidelines will result first in a meeting between leaders, parents, and/or member involved. If a resolution cannot be reached, Wendy Hein (County 4-H Agent) will be contacted and a meeting will be set up with her. If a resolution still cannot be reached, the involved person and/or persons will be asked to leave the group.
