Registration Information and Onsite Highlights

Registration Fee

The registration fee is \$15 per discipline (max of 2) if received by June 1 and \$20 per discipline if received thereafter but by June 9. Youth may also register for one elective (Hunting Skills or Western Heritage). Priority must be given to the discipline(s). **NO REGISTRATIONS ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 7** and **NO REFUNDS**. Credit cards accepted online. Checks are payable to OSU and mailed to Shooting Sports Registrar, 1211 SE Bay Boulevard, Newport, OR 97365.

Online Registration

Parents must register their youth online using the same Ideal-Logic interface used for the Mail-In Tournament. The site may be accessed from the Oregon 4-H State Shooting Sports website or by using this link: [State Contest Registration](#). Select either New Registration and proceed through until you may select STATE CONTEST, or click the Catalog tab and directly select STATE CONTEST from the list provided. Registrations are not complete until payment is received.

When signing up, please select the appropriate track (Entry Level or National Championship) and discipline(s). These **MUST** be the same as what the youth qualified in through the Mail-In Tournament. If you are uncertain, please consult with your club leader before signing up. Age divisions (which determine when you shoot) are automatically assigned based on date of birth. You will also be asked to update contact information and sign a Code of Conduct and Media Release. A new **Volunteer** page has also been added to encourage parents, leaders, and youth to help out onsite. This type of support is critical in ensuring a smooth event.

On-Site Requirements

- Details about the Albany Rifle and Pistol Club and Albany Gun Club are in the Contest Guide.
- All participants must bring a completed [current health form](#) (click to access and print current health form from state website). It must be signed by a parent or guardian.
- Clothing rules strictly enforced (see Contest Guide for rules).
- A parent or guardian must accompany all Junior members.
- Intermediates and Seniors must have a chaperone at each discipline.
- NO dogs are allowed on the Albany Rifle and Pistol Club or Albany Gun Club property.
- Ranges are NOT open to practice on Sunday.

Schedule

A draft schedule appears on page 3. A final, updated schedule will be provided onsite.

- Intermediates and Seniors shoot on **both** Monday and Tuesday, depending on discipline.
- Juniors shoot on Wednesday.
- Priority in scheduling will be given to youth registered for multiple disciplines.

Morning Check-In

Prior to the mandatory morning meeting, youth must check in at the North Range Classroom each day to turn in their health form as well as receive their scoresheets, final schedule, and other instructions. All youth must also have their equipment checked before the morning meeting at their discipline venue. **All participants (youth and adults) must attend the Mandatory Morning Meeting at 8:00 a.m. each day**, held under the big tent.

Things to Bring

1. Health form per participant, signed
2. Eye Protection – participants and spectators
3. Hearing Protection – participants and spectators
4. Firearms, archery equipment, arrow quivers
5. Ammunition/arrows
6. Shooting mats
7. Warm-up targets
8. Sunscreen
9. Food and water/beverage
10. Great attitude and flexibility
11. Hand-wipes (no running water)
12. Chairs
13. Acceptable clothing appropriate for weather and discipline

Hunting Skills Contest

Youth who qualified in any Shooting Sports discipline are eligible to participate in this year's Hunting Skills State Contest. Youth must provide all of their own equipment and demonstrate safe equipment handling in any course of fire they shoot. This event includes the Hunting Scenario & Hunter Decision Test, Wildlife Identification & Management Practicum, three live fire disciplines (Shotgun, Smallbore Rifle, and Archery), and a Map & Compass Skills Practicum. Although youth are not required to shoot all courses of fire, overall score and placement is based on all six portions of the contest. Registration fees are the same as qualifying disciplines. Western Action Shooting

Come gain an appreciation for the heritage of the Old West in the time period of 1860-1900 at this Western Heritage Project Demonstration. The event is open to Intermediate and Senior 4-H Shootings Sports youth and any adults interested in being a leader of the project. Participants will have the opportunity to shoot period firearms (rifle, pistol, shotgun) during a timed shoot – 4-H's version of Cowboy Action Shooting. Everyone is encouraged to dress in period outfits and join in the fun of bringing history to life. Registration fees are the same as qualifying disciplines. Ammunition and firearms will be provided. Western Action Shooting will be scheduled after all registrations are received.
