There may be two (2) medals per category annually if there is sufficient merit amongst nominees.

To be eligible for these awards, members must meet the following requirements:

- 1. County Medal recipients must be an Intermediate or Senior; Jr. Boy/Girl must be a Junior.
- 2. Members may receive only one project medal per year; members may only receive the Jr. Boy/Girl award once in their 4-H career.
- 3. If merited by outstanding accomplishment, members may receive the same medal once as an Intermediate and once as a Senior.
