#### Dear Prospective Master Gardener:

Thank you for your interest in the Oregon State University Master Gardener™ Volunteer Training Program. Master Gardeners (MGs) are volunteers trained by OSU Extension Service agents and specialists. To become an OSU Master Gardener™, you must complete the training program as well as volunteer a specified number of hours of public service through the Master Gardener program.

Volunteers receive training in botany, soil science, insect and disease identification and control, care and culture of ornamental plants, small fruits, lawns, home orchards and vegetables, diagnosis of plant problems, among other topics. Classes for 2020 will begin January 8, 2020 and continue each Wednesday through March 18, 2020. Classes are held from 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM at the Trinity Lutheran Church, 320 SE Fir Villa Road in Dallas. At the end of the class on March 11, trainees will receive an open-book exam based on the manual used in the class to take home. We will score the exam during the last day of class. The last day will also include a potluck lunch and tour of the Polk County Extension Office.

The second part of the education program begins after classes are completed. Volunteers give 60 hours of their time extending home horticulture information to other gardeners. At least 18 of those payback hours are spent in the Polk County Extension Office in Dallas, answering questions from homeowners on gardening topics. The other hours are spent on Polk County Master Gardener projects and outreach activities. Some of the activities include the working on the Inspiration Garden in Independence, the Plant Sale in May at the Polk County Fairgrounds and gardening clinics and workshops. Ideas from new members for community volunteer activities are always welcome, and if you have particular skills you would like to offer, we would like to hear about them!

The cost for this program is \$100, which covers class materials and is paid at the time of enrollment. We also offer a Non-Volunteer Option of \$250 for those who cannot participate as a volunteer, but want the gardening knowledge from the classes. Those who participate in this option will receive a Certificate of Completion rather than become a Certified Master Gardener. Both fee options include a copy of *Sustainable Gardening*, a comprehensive 500-page reference manual, prepared specifically for Oregon and Washington Master Gardeners.

If you feel you will have difficulty attending the training at these times, or performing 60 hours of volunteer time in return for the training, please the Polk County Extension Office to discuss this prior to applying for the program. If you cannot pay the \$100 fee or the \$250 fee at this time, contact the Extension Office (503-623-8395) to discuss possible payment options.

Class size is limited to 30 trainees. After we receive 30 applications names will be added to a waiting list in case of cancellations, so make sure to get your application in quickly! The last day for a full refund is January 15, 2020.

Enclosed you will find an Application Form and Position Description to be filled out and signed. Please return these with a check for \$100 for the Volunteer option, or \$250 for the Non-Volunteer option.

The deadline to apply is Wednesday, December 18, 2019.

### **Position Description**

Title: Oregon State University Extension Service Master Gardener<sup>TM</sup> Volunteer

**Purpose:** To provide research based and objective information and educational programs on sustainable home horticulture to the general public.

### Brief description of the position

- Answers general public questions and inquiries about gardening, landscape maintenance, pest management and related topics by telephone; at clinics, demonstrations, workshops, or informal classes; or in other ways possible and practical.
- Cooperates with an assists local OSU Extension faculty and staff.
- Keeps appropriate records, such as volunteer hours and public contacts; client questions and contact information.
- May assist in preparation of specific educational resources.

### Optional assigned duties (check if applicable)

Works directly with persons under the age of 18 years, as part of their assigned volunteer service; in
school gardens, community gardens, school garden programs, or in other venues
Drives a motor vehicle on behalf of Oregon State University Extension, as part of their assigned
volunteer service

### Requirements

- Must be available to participate in the training program for Master Gardener volunteers.
- Must be available to provide volunteer service to OSU Extension during the year that training is completed, and equivalent to the number of hours of training received.
- Must be able to effectively communicate with the public by telephone, personal contact, group contact, or in writing.
- Must demonstrate a commitment to diversity and to ensuring equal opportunity for those wishing to benefit from OSU Extension programs and services.
- Should have some knowledge and skills in basic horticulture and related areas.
