



4-H HORSE FAIR - 2019

PROCEDURES FOR ENTERING BENTON COUNTY

Please read this information carefully. Failure to follow these instructions exactly or to complete all the steps could make you ineligible to compete.

1. Fair entry forms (*attached*) must be turned in during 4-H Horse Pre-Fair no later than Sunday, June 16, 2019. Circle the number of every class you want to enter.
2. Participants must turn in their 4-H Records to the Benton County Extension Office by 5pm on **MONDAY, July 8, 2019** to be eligible for fair. Submitted records must be up to date and include the following:
 - i. **MY 4-H RESUME**
 - ii. Current year's **4-H NOTES** and *last year's completed 4-H Notes**
 - iii. Current year's **4-H HORSE RECORD** for each project horse and *last year's completed horse record(s)**
 - iv. **HORSE DECLARATION:** (*a copy should have been turned in to the Extension Office no later than April 16*)
 - v. **HORSE LEASE:** *If you are leasing a horse, you must include a copy of your lease agreement in your records (a copy should have been turned in to the Extension office no later than April 16).*
 - vi. **HORSE ADVANCEMENTS:** *Advancements were due into the Extension Office May 22*
 - vii. **PHOTO PAGES:** *Include no more than 3 pages of photos. The pages can be two sided (front and back for a total of 6 sides).*

*(*If this is your first year in 4-H, you will not have records from previous years.)*

3. Participants must have completed both the mandatory and recommended Advancement Steps as described in the Oregon 4-H Horse Advancement Program (*see page 3*) in order to compete in specific classes.
4. Participants, their parent/guardian, and a club leader must sign the fair entry form.
5. If you want to enter any Equine Art projects, fill out a static entry card (*available online & follow the county rules for exhibits*). *For submission times please see the fair schedule.*
6. All stall request(s) need to be submitted through club leaders.
7. Camping will be available to those who wish to stay at the fairgrounds. Contact your club leader for all of the details.

4-H HORSE FAIR RULES

1. Classes will be conducted according to 4-H rules and policies as set forth in the horse project materials, the PNW 4-H Horse Contest Guide, and the Benton County 4-H Horse Contest Outline.
2. Any concerns or grievances will be taken up with the Horse Fair Superintendents and/or the County Faculty.

3. Boots must be worn in ALL classes.
4. Approved helmets must be worn in all in-hand trail, riding, driving, and ground training classes.
5. All participants must do Showmanship.
6. The same horse must be used for showmanship, all equitation classes, and trail. Other horses may be used for other classes as long as 4-H records are kept on them.
7. All horses you show must have been obtained (bought or leased) by April 16, with a Lease or Horse Declaration on file at the Extension Office not later than April 16.
8. You must attend the Judge's Meeting on every day you show. If you miss the Judges Meeting or do not sign in, you will not show on that day.
9. Novice is an optional choice for members in their first year of showing. Once you have shown in your age division, you cannot move back to Novice. However, if you showed as a Novice at Pre-Fair, you may move to your age division for Fair.
10. The one-minute gate hold on classes will be strictly enforced unless special arrangements have been made prior to the class.
11. Herdsmanship will be judged on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 8am until classes end each day. Stall decorations must be completed by 9pm on Wednesday.
12. If you do Walk/Trot, you cannot enter in any gaming classes.
13. The same horse cannot be used in both Trail and In-hand Trail.
14. First Year Under Saddle horses may be ridden in Equitation classes.
15. Ranch Horse Roping consists of three levels: **1. Dummy roping from ground; 2. Dummy roping from horse; and 3. Live cow roping.** Juniors and Horseless members may only compete in dummy roping from ground. Intermediates may compete in dummy roping from ground or dummy roping from horse. Seniors may compete in any of the three levels.
16. If you are eligible for State Fair, you must use the same horse at State Fair that you qualified on at County Fair.

4-H STATE QUALIFYING RULES

Contestants who qualify for State Fair in equitation/showmanship may also enter **Dressage** if they received a score of 58% or higher on any Dressage Training Level Test or any First Level test at their county fair using the same horse as used in equitation/showmanship.

Additionally, contestants who qualify for State Fair in equitation/showmanship may also enter **Western Dressage** if they received a score of 58% or higher on Basic Progression Test, 4,5 or 6 or Level 1 Connection Test 1, 2, or 3.

Hunt Seat Equitation Over Fences (*Jumping*) contestants must qualify in equitation/showmanship and receive a blue ribbon at the County Fair using the same horse used for equitation and showmanship. Seniors must qualify on the 2'-9" course at the County Fair and Intermediates must qualify on the 2'-6" course.
