
Contest subject matter may include, but is not limited to, the following topics:

2019-20 4-H Enrollment

Enrollment Forms are available in our office or online at https://extension.oregonstate.edu/sites/ default/files/documents/9466/youth-enrollment.pdf

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE: Returning members wishing to receive an enrollment scholarship must fill out and return the enrollment and scholarship form **BEFORE January**, **15**, **2020** to be eligible to receive a scholarship. Scholarship amounts will be determined on a case by case basis. Members, or families, in most cases, will be expected to pay a portion of the enrollment fee.

- ⇒ If enrolled by Wednesday, January 15, 2020; the first two family members will be \$65 each; each additional family member will be \$35.
- ⇒ If enrolled: Jan 16 May 04; each member will be \$85.00; no family discount will be offered.
- ⇒ If enrolled on or after Tuesday, May 05, 2019; youth enrolling on or after this date will NOT be eligible to compete at County or State Fair.
- ⇒ **CLOVERBUD ENROLLMENT:** \$35.00 each regardless of date

4-H Levels for this year are calculated as of September 1, 2019:

5 - 8 years = Cloverbud 9 - 11 years = Junior 12 - 14 years = Intermediate 15 - 19 years = Senior



High School Seniors! Check out these Scholarships Available for you through Oregon 4-H!

The State 4-H Program in Oregon offers scholarships to college-bound high school seniors who are currently enrolled in the Oregon 4-H program, and have been members for a minimum of three years, including the current year. Specific eligibility information for each scholarship can be found by following the link below. Application must be approved and signed by the 4-H agent in your county Extensions Office. Counties will forward approved applications and the County Nomination Form to the State 4-H office before the March 1st deadline.

Selection is based 55% on the Resume, 35% on the story, and 10% on scholastic achievement.

New 4-H Engineering Design Exhibit Invites Creativity to Fair

A new 2020 county and state fair exhibit is open to any enrolled 4-H member to encourage participation for creators, inventors and problem solvers. The new Engineering Design Exhibit was created to allow members to communicate the processes and outcomes of solving an engineering problem of their choice.

The display is to include two parts: (1) an engineering notebook that details the member's use of the seven engineering design components and (2) an educational poster. The Engineering Display Component Check-Off Sheet lists the required engineering design components and other display information to assist the member in producing a successful exhibit. 4-H Insect Study for Intermediate and Senior Member Now More Accessible

There is a major change to the Entomology (Insects) Project display beginning in 2020. For members who are just starting to study insects as an Intermediate or Senior Member the first year display will require only 10 specimens which are to be from at least 8 orders. The 4-H Natural Science Committee hopes this will invite Intermediate and Senior members to try out insect collection and identification along with any other projects they may also be enrolled in.



University of Idaho and Oregon State University Extension offer Preserve @ Home-Oregon to teach adults how to safely preserve a variety of food products. Participants learn how to produce high quality preserved foods and the science behind food preservation and food safety.

Anyone with an interest in food preservation and food safety can enroll in Preserve @ Home. Individuals with little or no previous food preservation experience are welcome.

Students can progress through six weekly lessons at their own pace or at a time convenient to them. The first lesson will be released on January 16, with an online chat session each Thursday at 1:00 PM, beginning on January 23.

Participants can also participate in one hands-on lab to gain skills and confidence in pressure canning and boiling water canning. Hands-on labs are offered in many regions of Oregon: Saturday, February 29: Deschutes, Harney, Jackson, Klamath, Tillamook and Wallowa counties or Saturday, March 7: Columbia and Polk counties.

Shooting Sports Mail in Tournament

Welcome to the 2019-2020 4-H Shooting Sports Mail-In Tournament. The Archery portion of the tournament officially opens November 1, 2019, but registration and information regarding the 2019-2020 Mail-In Tournament is currently available on the 4-H website, https://

<u>extension.oregonstate.edu/4h/outdoor-education-recreation-projects#shooting-sports</u>. The link for registration and information regarding the Archery ONLY portion of the tournament are available there.

A few things to remember:

Each club MUST HAVE ONE LEADER registered for the tournament. Registration for the leader is FREE, but we need at least one leader registered for communication purposes. We will be sending an email to all past leaders who have registered in the Ideal-Logic system, but if you know of any new leaders please feel free to forward this email.

Registration for youth is \$10 regardless of the number of disciplines they are shooting. They can sign up for all of their disciplines now, but the Archery is currently the only discipline shooting for score.

The scoresheets, rules and other information for the remaining disciplines (Shotgun, Rifle, Pistol and Muzzleloading) will be available beginning in December as their first shoot is in January 2020. All of the information will be posted on the website (same link as above).

Scoresheets must be submitted no later than the 15th of the next month. For example, November

scores are due no later than December 15, 2019.

Keep Your Equine Partners Comfortable



YQCA, Get on Board

Finally a National online livestock quality assurance educational platform exists. YQCA is replacing PQA (pork quality assurance) and for a variety of state, regional, and national shows certification may be required for members who exhibit market animals and in the future for all who exhibit at certain shows. YQCA certification has been up and running smoothly for over a year. We also have several available "hands on" educators in Oregon teaching from the curriculum as well as sharing additional materials and curriculum.

The online curriculum is available for students at: http://yqca.org/

There is a fee to work through the curriculum and take the test to get certified. When local teachers are using the curriculum in hands on workshops to provide certification, there will also be a cost, unless they have local sponsors.

I encourage you to share this information with the auction committee, this may be something they are willing to sponsor in an effort to provide the best possible food to buyers.

While currently we are not requiring this certification to exhibit at county or state fair, I do encourage you to give it a try, utilize in your club education, and get our youth started today.



At its simplest, livestock judging consists of two parts:


Placing a group of animals
