The Bob Cate Memorial Scholarship of up to \$1000 is available for Linn County 4-H members who are graduating seniors and pursuing a degree in an agricultural related career.

The scholarship is a tribute to the contributions of Bob Cate to the Linn County Agricultural Industry. In 1932, Bob Cate's family moved to a farm north of Lebanon on Highway 20, at what later became known as Cate's Corner. He worked on the farm in his youth and also helped raise turkeys. He graduated from Lebanon High School in 1944. He was active in FFA and was the state tractor driving champion in his senior year. He worked the family farm throughout his life, increasing its size and adding a grain brokerage business.

The scholarship will recognize a Linn County 4-H member who has developed a broad based 4-H experience of leadership, community service and 4-H livestock projects.

Applications are due Monday, May 10th.

The scholarship will be awarded at the fair. A check will be made to the college/vocational/technical school upon receipt of fall registration.
