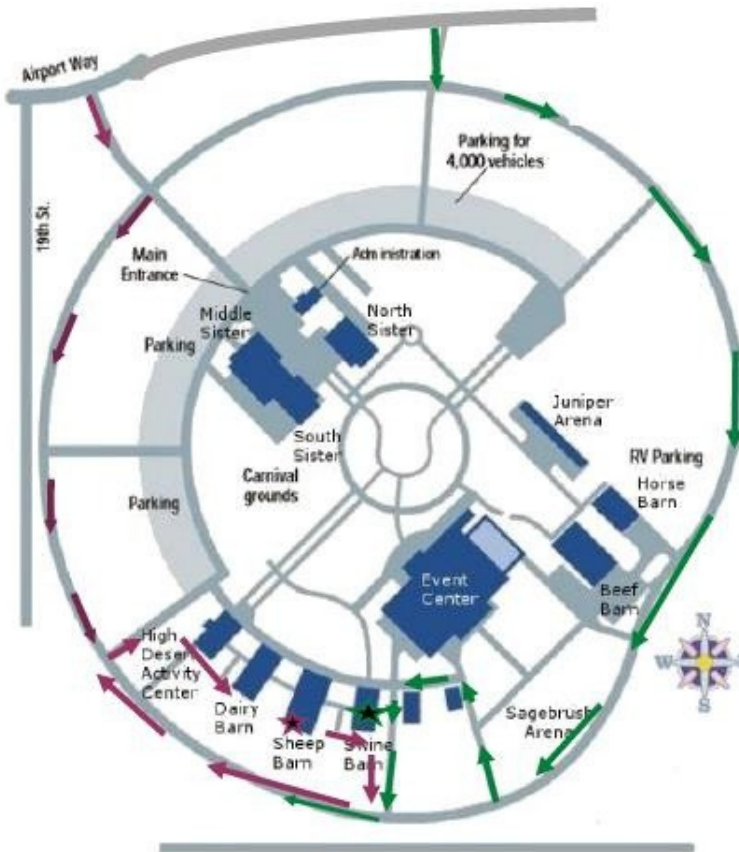

Sheep & Market Goat

Please follow the pink arrows on the attached map. Please enter through the South entrance (by Peterson CAT) and turn right to proceed around to the sheep barn. Turn left at the first driveway behind the HDAC Building past the Swine barn, turning right, then right again, and go out (Bunny Barn), continue to the Sheep barn. You will exit driving the same gate you entered through.



Swine

Please follow green arrows on the attached map. Enter the fair-grounds through the North entrance (closest to the airport) and turn left to proceed around to the swine barn. You will pull into one of the three scales. Exiting will be to your right on the main road and exit through the gate near the Coastal Pavilion Building.

IMPORTANT

- **ALL Swine exhibitors will need to bring Prop 12 paperwork at Pre-Fair weigh-in.**
- Sheep & Goat exhibitors will need to fill out a Country of Origin Affidavit/Declaration Form
- All Exhibitors will need to sign the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
- At Weigh-In we will have weigh-in slips, tags, taggers.

LEASED ANIMALS

1. All animals exhibited must have been carried under the exhibitor's care in a 4-H project since **May 15, horse, 90 days prior to fair**, and **guide dogs since Aug. 1**; exception: newly born rabbits or hatched poultry. Leased animals are the full responsibility of the exhibitor. 4-Her must be responsible for full care of the animal. See Auction rules for market animal possession dates. Exhibitors must own the animals they exhibit, exception: leased animals, guide dogs, brace dogs and obedience team dogs.)

2. All leases shall run through the end of Oregon State Fair, and will include ear tag number, tattoo number and/or brands on the animal.

3. Member must be responsible for the full care of the livestock project. Lease forms must be a part of the record book and must be submitted to 4-H office.

4. Lease forms must be on file in 4-H office by June 1.

- Have completed an educational requirement. (ie. participated in a workshop, educational clinic, etc.)
- Make sure to have project records for any project area you plan to submit to exhibit at fair.
- Will need to complete 4 advancements in each project area where required.

We will also have record book checks available for walk-ins.

If for any reason these dates absolutely don't work out, you must make prior arrangements with Morgan, Christina, or Brandi before the last record book check date.

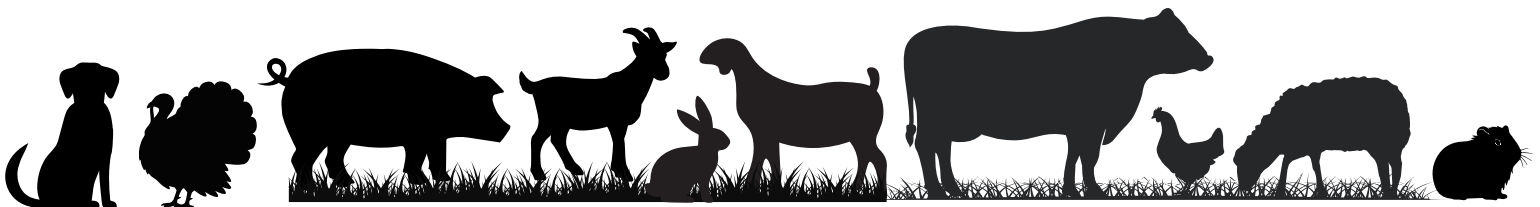

YQCA Certification Required for All 2026 County Fair Exhibitors

All youth planning to show animals at the 2026 County Fair must have current Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification.

If you completed the official YQCA training, earned a certificate, and submitted it in 2025, your certification is already on record. Oregon 4-H recognizes official YQCA certificates for three years from the completion date listed on the certificate.

Please note: Webinar participation for Horse, Dog, and Small Animal from the 2024–2025 year will be honored for three years. However, if youth are exhibiting a livestock animal in the 2025–2026 year, they will be required to complete YQCA training.

YOUTH SMALL ANIMAL SHOW



Pre-Registration deadline: Friday, May 22

- 4-H Rules Apply: Must participate in a showmanship class to be eligible for conformation classes.
